Kansas youth smoking rates have declined since 2000 but remain at high levels. According to the 2002 Kansas Youth tobacco survey, 21 percent of all Kansas high school kids smoke, and 15 percent of high

school males use spit tobacco. In Kansas, the tobacco industry spends an estimated \$106.4 million per year to market their products.

This grant is sponsored by TASK through a grant from the American Legacy Foundation. The American Legacy Foundation was formed as a result of the tobacco master settlement with states and seeks to counter the messages youths receive from the tobacco industry.
