

# Youths showcase livestock at spring show

The Spring Livestock Bonanza was last month at the Sherman County fairgrounds.

Participants were from Goodland, Edson, Kanorado, Colby, Brewster, Scott City, Oakley, Hays, Washington, Sharon Springs, Bird City, St. Francis, Weskan, Utica and Cuba, Kan.; and Fort Collins, Wray and Burlington, Colo.

Sherman County participants were Brandon, Amber, Lacie and Jason Cowan; Mikail and T.J. Freeman; Josiah Goodley; Michael Hall; Jonah and Jonathan McClung; John and Jace Mosbarger; Cy Paxton; Clay Schilling; Courtney and Kade Sheldon; and Ryan and Garrett Taylor.

Area youths who placed included:

**Goodland:** Garrett Taylor, reserve champion in junior beef showmanship and reserve champion in junior swine showmanship; John Mosbarger, class champion in all other breeds in the steer show; Jace Mosbarger, class champion in cross breed in the steer show and grand champion steer in the show; and Michael Hall, reserve class champion in cross breed Class 1.

Taylor, reserve champion in the junior division of swine showmanship; Lacie Cowan, third in the junior division of swine showmanship; Jonathan McClung, third in Class 2 Suffolk in the sheep show; Courtney Sheldon, sixth in Class 1 and Class 2 cross breed in the sheep show; and Amber Cowan, fifth in the senior division of swine showmanship.

T.J. Freeman had the third-place animal in Duroc 1 in the swine show, and Mikail Freeman took fourth. Ryan Taylor was third in Duroc 2, and Michael Hall was fourth. Jonathan McClung was sixth in Hamp 1, and Cy Paxton was seventh. Hall was second in cross breed 1, and Taylor was third.

Garrett Taylor was fifth in cross breed 3 and fourth in cross breed 4. He also had the third-place shorthorn heifer. Ryan Taylor had the sixth-place cross breed heifer.

John Mosbarger had the first-place steer in all other breeds, and Jace Mosbarger had the first place and over all champion cross breed

steer.

Jace Mosbarger was third in intermediate beef showmanship, and Garrett Taylor was the reserve champion in junior beef showmanship.

**Edson:** Clay Schilling had the second-place cross breed and the third-place all other breeds in the beef show. He was the intermediate champion in beef showmanship and the intermediate champion in swine showmanship and had the class reserve champion in cross breed in the heifer show.

Schilling had the class champion and the fourth-place animal in Hamp Class 1 in the market swine show.

**Brewster:** Ashley Carpenter had the champion Hamp and the reserve grand champion York in the swine show. She had the class champion in Hamp class 2, the overall champion in Hamp, the class champion in York and the overall grand reserve champion in the swine show. Carpenter was fourth in senior swine showmanship.

**Bird City:** Jacquelyn Ketzner was champion in junior beef showmanship and junior sheep showmanship and was fourth in class 2 in Suffolk and fifth in class 2 in cross breed in the sheep show.

**St. Francis:** Darin Wiley was the champion and Cody Raile was fifth in senior beef showmanship. Raile had the class champion and reserve class champion Gelbvieh in the heifer show.

Wiley had the class champion in cross breed and the class reserve champion in all other breeds in the heifer show and the grand champion heifer. Raile had the reserve champion heifer.

Wiley had the class champion in shorthorn in the steer show and the grand reserve cross breed steer.

Amber Havel had the fourth-place Hamp, the fifth-place Suffolk and the third and fourth-place cross breeds in the sheep show. She had the third-place York in the swine show.

Wiley had the reserve champion in all other breeds in heifers, and R.L. Walz had the third-place heifer.

Cody Raile had the first in class Gelbvieh heifer; it was the reserve

champion overall in the beef show. He also had the second-place Gelbvieh, and Matt Raile had the third-place heifer in the class.

Wiley had the first-place cross breed heifer; it was the overall champion. He also had the first-place shorthorn steer, and it was the overall reserve champion. Grady Brunk had the fifth-place cross breed heifer, and Laura Brunk had the seventh-place heifer in the class.

Matt Raile was fifth in intermediate beef showmanship, and Laura Brunk was third in junior beef showmanship.

**Weskan:** Garrett Riess had the reserve class champion shorthorn in the steer show. He was the reserve champion in intermediate swine showmanship. He was the reserve champion in intermediate swine showmanship.

He had the second-place Maine in the steer show, and the third-place animal in cross breed 2 in the swine show.

Dakota Riess had the class champion in cross breed class 2 in the market swine show. Riess had the first-place animal in cross breed 2 in the swine show and the third-place cross breed steer.


