

Goodland swimmers place fourth in Burlington

The Goodland swim team placed fourth out of 10 teams Saturday and swimmers won seven individual events at the meet in Burlington.

Daniel Blake earned first place in three events in the 15-18 boys category, winning the 50-yard freestyle in 26.81 seconds, the 100-yard freestyle in 59.22 seconds and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1 minute, 17.14 seconds.

Hannah Blake, his sister, won two gold medals in the 11-12 girls competition, winning the 50-yard freestyle in 32.07 seconds and the 100-yard freestyle in 1 minute 11.59 seconds. She was third in the 100-yard individual medley.

Riley Oharah won the 9-10 boys 25-yard freestyle in 15.67 seconds. He also placed second in the 100-yard freestyle and the 25-yard butterfly.

Brennan Clouse won the 13-14 boys 100-yard breaststroke in 1

minute, 26.69 seconds. He placed second in the 100-yard freestyle and third in the 50-yard freestyle.

In the 8-and-under girls competition, Taryn Bedore placed third in the 100-yard individual medley, fourth in the 50-yard freestyle and fourth in the 25-yard butterfly. For 8-and-under boys, Zach Miller placed third in the 25-yard breaststroke and was sixth in the 25-yard freestyle. Drew House also competed at the meet.

Erik Roeder placed fourth in the 11-12 boys 50-yard backstroke and the 100-yard individual medley. He also was fifth in the 50-yard breaststroke.

Chelsey Horney placed fourth in the 12-13 girls 100-yard backstroke and was fifth in the 50-yard freestyle. Tanner Oharah placed sixth in the 13-14 boys 100-yard breaststroke.

Kerek Mason took the silver in

the 15-18 boys 100-yard breaststroke. He finished third in the 100-yard freestyle and fourth in the 50-yard freestyle.

Goodland's 8-and-under girls 100-yard medley relay team of Bedore, Elizabeth House, Rachel Horney and Shycol Woodrow earned the silver medal. The same combination, as Goodland A team, placed fourth in the 100-yard freestyle relay while the B team of Brianna and Berkley White, Megan Siruta and Kaitlyn Larie was fifth.

Goodland's 9-10 boys 100-yard relay team of Randy Cochran, Drew Sherlock, R. Oharah and Parker Sieck placed fourth. The 9-10 mixed 100-yard medley team of Chloe Goodwin, Woodrow, R. Oharah and Sieck finished fourth.

Colby won the team competition with 348.5 points, following by the host Burlington team with 208. Holyoke was third with 196.5.

Goodland's point total was 113.

Goodland opened its season June 5 with a fifth-place finish at the meet in Holyoke. Goodland swimmers won five individual events there.

D. Blake won both the 15-18 boys 100-yard freestyle, in 1 minute .25 second, and the 100-yard breaststroke, in 1 minute 16.65 seconds. H. Blake won the 11-12 girls 50-yard freestyle.

D. Blake also placed second in the 100-yard butterfly. H. Blake took home the silver medal in the 100-yard freestyle and was third in the 100-yard individual medley.

R. Oharah won the 9-10 boys 25-yard freestyle in 16.15 seconds. He also placed second in both the 100-yard freestyle and the 25-yard butterfly. Clouse won the 13-14 boys 100-yard freestyle in 1 minute, 10.09 seconds. Clouse also was second in the 100-yard breaststroke and third in the 50-yard freestyle.

Bedore was fifth in the 8-and-under girls 25-yard butterfly and sixth in the 100-yard individual medley. Zach Miller was sixth in both the 8-and-under boys 25-yard freestyle and 25-yard backstroke.

Abby Jolly and Kassarah Woodrow swam in the 9-10 girls competition.

In the 11-12 boys competition, Roeder placed fourth in both the 50-yard backstroke and the 100-yard individual medley. He also was sixth in the 100-yard freestyle. Lee Entwistle also competed at the meet.

T. Oharah placed third in the 13-14 boys 100-yard freestyle and sixth in the 100-yard breaststroke. C. Horney was third in the 13-14 girls 100-yard butterfly.

Mason finished second in three events: the 15-18 boys 50 and 100-yard freestyle, and the 100-yard breaststroke.

The 8-and-under mixed 100-yard freestyle relay team of Bedore, S. Woodrow, R. Horney and Miller won the gold medal in 1 minute 55.65 seconds. The same combination also placed second in the 100-yard medley relay.

The 13-14 mixed relay team of Halli Stone, Clouse, C. Horney and T. Oharah placed third in both the 200-yard freestyle and medley relays.

Colby won the meet with 329 points. Holyoke, the host, was second with 220 followed by Burlington with 189. Wray was fourth with 105 with Goodland just one point behind.

The teams will swim in Oakley on Saturday and in Colby a week later. They will take the Fourth of July weekend off, then compete at the Northwest Kansas Swim League meet in Wray July 9-10.

Scott City sweeps Goodland in doubleheader

Goodland's American Legion baseball team dropped both games of a doubleheader at Scott City last Wednesday, losing the first game 9-1 and the second 13-2.

In the first game, things got off to a great start for Goodland when Jake Alander hit a solo home run to left field to lead off. However Scott City's defense stiffened, Goodland's next batter struck out, and the next two hit long fly balls to center field.

Helped by a stolen base and a Goodland error, Scott City scored a run of its own in the bottom of the first to tie the game going into the second. The teams held each other to a "three-and-out" series in the second.

Scott City's defense continued to be tough, holding Goodland to another "three-and-out" in the top of the third. Scott City scored three runs during its turn at the plate to take a 4-1 lead going into the fourth. Neither team scored in the fourth inning.

In the top of the fifth, Goodland got a couple of runners on base but could not bring them home. In the bottom of the inning, Scott City

scored three more runs to increase its lead to 7-1.

Scott City added two more runs in the sixth inning after holding Goodland to another "three-and-out" to take an eight-run lead.

In the second game, like the first,

Goodland took a 1-0 lead in the top of the first inning on a run scored by Alander. Again leading off, he was hit by a pitch, got to second base on an error and later stole third. He was driven home when Wyatt Dautel, the next batter, hit a double.

After holding Goodland scoreless in the top of the third, Scott City got four more runs to increase its lead to 13-1. Scott City was scoreless in the bottom of the fourth.


