

County orders two more weather radios for program

Weather radios have been installed at 10 major facilities in the city, and last Tuesday the county commissioners agreed to order two more to be installed at the library and senior center.

Mary Messamore, head of the dispatch center and emergency management for the county, asked the commissioners for permission to add the two sites. The weather radios are part of an effort to have the county named StormReady by the National Weather Service.

The locations with weather radios are the hospital, Good Samaritan

Center, school district office, City Administration Building, courthouse, Wheat Ridge Acres, the city softball complex and post offices in Goodland, Kanorado and Edson.

The radios are purchased from Fixsen Electronics at \$49.49 each.

The weather service established the "StormReady" program to help cities and counties be sure they have procedures in place to reduce the potential for disaster.

Among the requirements are a 24-hour communication point, which is the central dispatch office, and an emergency operations center,

both in the basement of the city building. A system for training and activation of storm spotters is another requirement.

In other business the commissioners:

- Approved the reappointment of two members of the Mid States Port Authority for four-year terms, Norman Nelson, a banker from Norton, and Mary Jo Downey, economic development director from Flagler, Colo.
- Received a letter from the Kansas Bureau of Investigation saying the county would no longer be responsible for paying the \$200 per month for the router service between the county dispatch center and the state system. Messamore said she had the same letter. She said the county had begun paying the monthly bill last year when they were notified it was being pushed onto the counties. She said some counties decided not to pay, and the Legislature this year required the KBI to pay this cost. The letter says the Legislature did not give the KBI any additional money to cover the cost, but that the counties would not be charged after July 1.

• Accepted a oil and gas lease from Press Oil Co. for 116 acres of right-of-way. The lease provides about \$2,900 up front, and is set up that if there is a producing well found on a quarter where there is county right-of-way, then the county will get one-eighth royalty of the production after all the transmission costs are taken off. Commissioner Mitch Tiede said he felt this was sort of a bonus, and that it would be great if the county gets any money.

• Approved allowing courthouse employees and others designated by department heads to have photo identification cards made through the treasurer's office. The photo identification is to allow them to prove they are county employees where it will allow a government discount.

- Hired Shelly Angelos as the principal for West Elementary School next school year and accepted the resignation of J.D. Hooper as the high school boys golf coach and as an assistant football coach.
- Voted 6-0 to give a 30-40 cent

perraise, depending on schedule for hourly staff for the 2004-2005 school year. The board unanimously approved a 2 percent raise in the salary schedule for the district's year-long supervisory

staff. Selby declined to accept the raise in his salary.

- Voted 6-0 to continue membership in the Western Plains Art Association. The annual fee is \$250 which entitled the district to two

adult and 20 children's tickets to each sponsored event.

The meeting adjourned around 9 p.m. The next regular meeting will be at 7 p.m. Monday, June 28, at the district office, 1312 Main Ave.




