"They are both very involved in just about any community organization that is making a difference, and they do not hesitate to become even more involved when called on.

"Pat organizes the annual food basket give away for Christmas to needy families, and with the assistance of Clark and a couple of hundred dedicated volunteers, over 120 food and toy baskets are made up for families each year.

"When you come into Goodland, ask about Clark and Pat Jordan; everyone knows, supports and loves them. They are true examples of what caring individuals can do when they believe in a good cause.
