Libraries to get Spanish-language collections with federal grant

The Goodland Star-News A federal grant will bring rotating collections of Spanish and English/ Spanish reading materials to northwest Kansas and may provide the springboard for more comprehensive Spanish-language collections for area libraries.

The Goodland Public Library has a small collection of Spanish books, audiocassettes and videocassettes, mostly for children, said Director Janet Warren, and might be able to help more people by having the adult materials in the rotating collections.

Those will be chosen as part of the pilot program. Bell said. She said those participating may change, but she the Goodland library is among

those that expressed interest.

The Goodland library has a few Spanish-speaking patrons, Director Warren said. She and Marcia Smith. school librarian, got a grant to buy Spanish materials in 2001, mostly for children. Warren said the library doesn't have much of an adult collection in Spanish.

The books are mostly wellknown English books translated into Spanish, she added, including some Dr. Seuss and a few Harry Potter books. The library also has some "easy readers," she said, with the words in Spanish on one page and English on the other.

The traveling collections would

be a nice supplement for the library, Warren said.

The 18-month grant has to be completed by September, Bell said, so the library system is hoping to have the program started by the first of the year. The collections have to be purchased and put together first, she said.

Since no one at the library system speaks Spanish, Bell said, the organization will be seeking outside help to determine what to purchase.

She said they aren't sure what will be most popular. The group plans to get a variety of materials for all ages, Bell said, a shelf full for each collection.

The grant and matching funds from the library system will pay for that, she said, but the system hopes the collections will be a springboard for adding more Spanish materials down the road.

The libraries the system serves can get almost anything on loan, she said, but they need to have something on hand to bring people in.

The need was shown in 2000 Census numbers, she said, which showed that 3 percent of the population of northwest Kansas is Spanish-speaking.
