Walter "Jim" Bisbee, 84, Great Bend, a former printer and composing room foreman for the old *Sherman County Herald*, died Friday, July 2, 2004, at the Central Kansas Medical Center in Great Bend.

He was born Nov. 21, 1919, at Dustin, Okla., the son of Lewis H. and Lucinda (Tucker) Bisbee.

On Dec. 6, 1941, he married Minnie James at Mena, Ark. He was a printer and composing room foreman for the *Herald* for 17 years and for *The Great Bend Tribune* for 22 years, retiring in 1987.

Farmer showed off sample of nearly five-foot 'macaroni' wheat

**July 6, 1904:** Big Macaroni Wheat — T.P. Crawford, who lives six miles south, was in Goodland showing a sample of durum or macaroni wheat raised on his farm.

The sample just lacked two inches measuring five feet in height, and Mr. Crawford says he has 25 acres, all of which is as good as the sample.

The heads are long and big, and supposing it will make 50 bushels to the acre, which is not an exaggerated estimate, he will reap 1,250 bushels from his 25 acres. This is the way this type of wheat is beginning

to grow in the county.
