

Goodland swimmers win 12 events

The Goodland swim team ended its 2004 summer season last weekend, placing fourth at the Northwest Kansas Swim League Championship Meet in Wray, Colo.

Goodland swimmers brought home gold medals in 10 individual events and two relays. Two swimmers from Goodland tied for the League Championship Trophy, which is awarded to the boy and girl in each age group who earns the most points during the two-day meet.

Nine swimmers earned trophies for being one of the top six point-earners in their group during the season.

Daniel Blake won four events in the boys 15-18 competition. He won the 50-yard freestyle in 26.41 seconds, the 100-yard freestyle in 57.53 seconds, the 400-yard freestyle in 4 minutes 56.56 seconds and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1 minute 14.73 seconds.

Blake placed second in the 200-yard freestyle. The 33 points he earned at the meet placed him in a tie for the League Championship Trophy, and Blake was the top point-earner in his age group this season with 106.

Riley O'Harah won two events in the 9-10 boys competition. He won the 25-yard freestyle in 15.31 seconds and the 25-yard breaststroke in 20.77 seconds. O'Harah also placed second in the 100-yard freestyle, 100-yard individual medley and the 25-yard butterfly.

O'Harah's 29 points during the weekend earned him a tie for the League Championship Trophy. He was the second highest point-earner in his age group this season with 99.

Hannah Blake, Daniel's sister, won two events in the 11-12 age group. She won the 50-yard freestyle in 31.19 seconds and the 200-yard freestyle in 2 minutes 44.19 seconds. She also placed second in the 100-yard freestyle, finished fourth in the 50-yard butterfly and fifth in the 100-yard individual medley. Her 92 points this season was second in her age group.

In the 13-14 boys competition, Brennan Clouse won the 100-yard freestyle in 1 minute 9.88 seconds and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1

minute 24.09 seconds. He also placed second in the 50-yard freestyle and third in both the 200-yard freestyle and 100-yard breaststroke.

Goodland won the 8-and-under mixed 100-yard freestyle with the team of Zach Miller, Kaitlyn Laue, Drew House and Holton Witman. Goodland also won the 9-10 mixed 100-yard medley relay with the team of Chloe Goodwin, Kassarah Woodrow, O'Harah and Abby Jolly.

Other top six finishers from Goodland in the 8-and-under girls competition include Taryn Bedore, who placed third in the 25-yard butterfly. Bedore finished sixth in the 50-yard freestyle, 25-yard backstroke and 100-yard individual medley. Shycol Woodrow finished fifth in the 25-yard backstroke.

Goodland placed second in the girls 8-and-under 100-yard medley relay with Elizabeth House, S. Woodrow, Bedore and Megan Siruta. Bedore, House and Siruta teamed up with Rachel Horney to place third in the 100-yard freestyle

relay. Bedore was sixth in points during the season with 39.

In the 8-and-under boys competition, Witman placed second in the 25-yard backstroke, third in both the 25 and 50-yard freestyle, and was fourth in the 25-yard butterfly. Miller placed second in the 25-yard breaststroke, fourth in the 50-yard freestyle and fifth in the 25-yard freestyle.
