

Toxoplasmosis is an infection caused by Toxoplasma gondii, a microscopic parasite that can live inside the cells of humans and animals, especially farm animals and

by touching infected cat feces, even tiny, "invisible" amounts, or by eating undercooked, infected meat. Although the infection doesn't normally spread from person to person, toxoplasmosis can rarely contaminate blood transfusions and organs donated for transplantation.
