The Kansas Class 4A football districts have been reorganized for the 2004-2005 school year, with the Cowboys gaining a couple of new opponents this fall, and trading longer trips east for a couple of trips south.

Goodland and Colby high schools remained in District 15 while Scott City and Ulysses are now in District 16 with Hugoton and Larned. Making the move to District 15 are Clay Center and Concordia; neither team qualified for the state playoffs last season.

Concordia is about 280 miles away from Goodland and Clay Center about 290 compared to 100 miles to Scott City and 140 to Ulysses.

The Cowboys will face Class 4The Cowboys will face Class 4A opponents in each of the final four games of the 2004 regular season. On Oct. 8, Goodland travels to Ulysses to play the Tigers. Last year, the Cowboys defeated Ulysses 15-0 in Cowboy Stadium for the Tigers' only loss of the regular season. Ulysses lost in the first round of the playoffs to Pratt.

On Oct. 15, the Cowboys will be on the road again to face more Tigers in Clay Center in the first game of district competition. Clay Center, which at 4,525 population is slightly smaller than Goodland, is about 43 miles northeast of Salina at the intersection of U.S. 24 and K-15.

Goodland will end its regular season with two home games. On Oct. 22, the Panthers of Concordia visit Cowboy Stadium. The Panthers won the Class 4A state champion-
