tion and arbitration process, and the pool will not be heated this week except by the sun. This is the last week the pool is to be open anyway, he said.

In other business, the commission:

- Approved a payment to Strukel Electric of \$58,859 for work completed on the airport lighting project. Pickman said the project is

about 30 percent complete.

- Approved a payment of \$5,011 to Evans, Bierly and Hutchison for engineering work on the airport lighting project.

- Approved a request for payment of \$50,203 from the Federal Aviation Administration for its share of the work completed on the airport lighting project.

- Approve a request for payment of \$6,741 from the Kansas Department of Transportation for completed

work on the airport lighting project.

- Approved a resolution naming Rod Blake, power plant supervisor, as the city's representative to the Municipal Energy Agency of Nebraska Management Committee, and naming Chuck Lutters, public works director, as the alternative.

- Approved a resolution to allow the city to prepare financial statements on the base of cash receipts and expenditures. This is an annual resolution which allows the city to

use the cash base accounting rather than the accrual method under state law. Pickman said it would cost the city more money to comply with the state budget laws.

- Approved bills totaling \$606,606. Billinger asked about a bill for safety vests, and Pickman said the police department had purchased a new one for every officer. He said it was necessary because the useful life of the old vests had run out after five years.

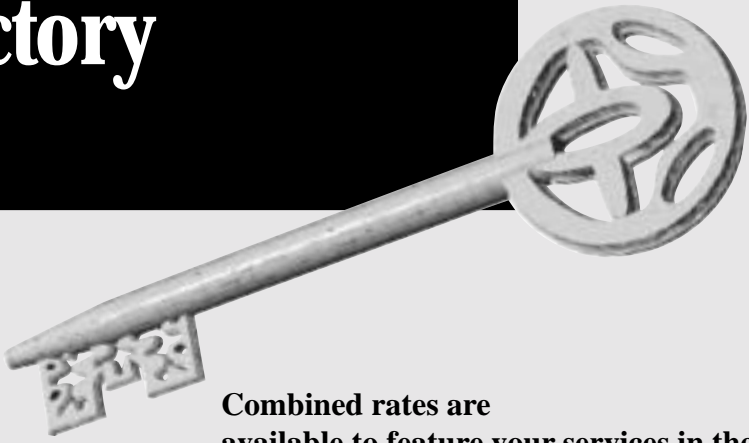
