whoever was doing these things. We are glad we were able to be on the scene at the right time. The investigation is not over, and we continue to look at all the events of the past two weeks."

Lambrecht said he was glad Smee had explained the situation before they hauled the coach away.

"I know living across the street I had been worried about these things taking place," Lambrecht said. "I was trying to guess — like everyone else — who might have been doing it, and was completely surprised when Smee said it was the coach himself. I wish the best for him, and hope he can get some help. It seems like he had to get this done and get caught before he had to face teaching or coaching this week."

Lambrecht said a woman who lives across the alley behind Diehl's home told him she had seen the coach on the roof before the fire started.

The fire Saturday was reported about 11 p.m.. It was the second arson fire reported at that address in a week. Smee said a 911 call came into the dispatch center at 11:10 p.m. that the roof of the house at 1108 Harrison was on fire.

"The neighbors reacted to the fire, and were getting the fire out as the Goodland fire department arrived," Smee said Monday.

Over the past two weeks, Diehl had claimed he was the target of harassment stemming from a party where he had called the Sherman County sheriff's office to report drugs being used. Charges in that incident are pending, said County Attorney Bonnie Selby.
