-stor-news Goodland opens season with home meet Thursday

The Goodland High and Grant Junior High cross country teams will open their season at home Thursday with the Goodland Invitational at Sugar Hills Golf Course.

There will be six races, starting at 4 p.m. Coach Don Smith said he expects more than 200 runners from 14 schools to participate. The first race will be the freshman and sophomore girls two-mile run, followed by the freshman and sophomore boys, who will run 5,000 meters (3.1 miles).

Next will be the junior and senior girls, who also will run two miles, then the junior and senior boys 5,000-meter race. After the high school races come the junior high events, with the girls running first, followed by the boys. Both will run one mile.

The Cowgirls have seven runners this season, three from Goodland and four from Wallace County High School. Smith said the girls from Sharon Springs will compete as members of Goodland's team until the Northwest Kansas League meet Oct. 16 in Hoxie.

Smaller schools which don't have a cross country program can send their athletes to another school for training and competition. Both school boards must approve the agreement, which also must be approved by the Kansas High School Activities Association.
