Senior Derrick Raymer was a two-time second team pick as a wide receiver and as a defensive back. Offensively, Raymer caught nine passes for 168

tackles, including a sack, and recovered two fumbles. Raymer also was the Cowboys' punter, averaging 38 yards per kick.

Three Goodland players received honorable mention on last year's all-league team: Junior Bobby Miller as a running back, senior Bret Jarmin as a defensive end and senior Jake Johnson at center.

McLean said Johnson, who had knee surgery last spring, will be questionable for tonight's game. He said senior Anthony Benavides, who has been having hamstring problems, also is questionable for tonight.

The Hoxie Indians, a Class 2A team, were 9-3 in 2003, making it to the quarterfinals of the state playoffs. Last year, Goodland defeated Hoxie 35-16 at Cowboy Stadium in the first game of the season.

Sophomore Don Raymer, a wide receiver on Garden City Community College's football team, caught a pass for eight yards to help his team win its season opener 27-17 over Dodge City Community College.

Raymer, in his second season with the Broncbusters, is a 2003 graduate of Goodland High School where he lettered in football and golf. Raymer played in all 10 games for Garden City last year. As a wide receiver, he caught four passes for 58 yards, and on special teams he returned one kickoff for seven yards. Last season the Broncbusters were 5-5 overall and 4-3 in the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference, and were picked No. 3 in the conference coaches' preseason poll. The team travels to Coffeyville on Saturday for their first road game of the season. The Red Ravens, picked No. 2 in the coaches' preseason poll, scored a touchdown with 14 seconds left in the game to defeat Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College 23-20 in their season opener Aug. 26.
