

# Cowgirls have tough time at Phillipsburg tournament

The Cowgirls had a tough time at the Phillipsburg Quad tennis tournament Tuesday, winning just three of 12 matches and finishing last. “We didn’t compete very well,” said Coach Wallace Hansen, “not as well as at Cimarron.”

Sophomore Jillian Parker, playing

No. 1 singles, was one of three players who went 1-3, but was awarded second place because she won more total games than the other two. Parker is now 2-7 for the season.

Hansen said the Cowgirls had to compete without one of their better players, sophomore Jena McCall,

who played No. 1 doubles with sophomore Sandy Johnson at Cimarron on Aug. 26. As a result, the No. 2 doubles team of juniors Kali Rietcheck and Megan Stefan moved up to No. 1, and Johnson teamed up with sophomore Jessica Lu at No. 2 doubles.

Rietcheck and Stefan went 1-2 and finished third; as a team they are 5-3 for the season. Johnson and Lu also went 1-2 and finished third.

Senior Grace Langness, playing No. 2 singles, went 0-3 in Phillipsburg and is now 3-5 overall.

The Phillipsburg Lady Panthers

won the tournament with both of their doubles team going 3-0 and taking first place. Victoria and Osborne tied for second. Victoria’s Angie Garner and Kelsi Wilson won at No. 1 and No. 2 singles, respectively, both going 3-0.

The Cowgirls will compete Saturday at a tournament in Colby starting at 8 a.m. (Mountain Time). Goodland also will participate in a junior varsity tournament in Tribune next Thursday which was originally scheduled for Tuesday.

The first home tournament will be Thursday, Sept. 14.

## Vintage cars to race in Norton

Vintage race cars from the 1950s and '60s take to the track at Elmwood Park Speedway in Norton Sept. 4-5.

“Last year we had 31 cars,” said Premier Racing Association organizer Don McMullen. “This year we are expecting 40-50 vintage racers, plus as an added attraction for our fans and drivers, we will have modern-day 305 winged sprint cars.”

Saturday, the sprint cars will be

the advertised main attraction. The Kansas Antique Racers, Colorado Vintage Oval Racers and Big Car Racing Association will be participating between the 305 sprint cars.

Sunday, the vintage cars will be on the track all day with a noon meal provided for racers and exhibitors.

The back gates open at 2 p.m. both days, the pits open at 4 p.m. and track action starts at 6:30 p.m.

“We will have static displays outside the racetrack area in the morning,” McMullen said. “People will be interested to know that some of the cars on exhibition were built in this area.”

The different classes of vintage cars on display will include the super modifieds, junior modifieds, midjets and sprint cars. The oldest car expected in the show is a midjet from the 1940s.
