## stor-news Sports Cowboys stampede Hoxie Indians, 40-12

The Goodland Star-News The Goodland Cowboys rolled up 448 yards on their way to a 40-12 road victory Friday over the Hoxie Indians to open the 2004 football season.

The first half belonged to Goodland, as senior fullback Brock Lohr scored a touchdown in the first quarter and senior quarterback Derrick Raymer ran for two more in the second to give the Cowboys a 21-0 lead.

About two minutes into the second half, Lohr scored his second touchdown, increasing Goodland's lead to 27-0. Later in the period, Hoxie senior Jordan Vickers ran up the middle for a 53-yard touchdown to put the Indians on the board 27-6. Less than a minute later, Lohr rushed for his third touchdown to make it 34-6.

In the fourth quarter, senior tailback Lane Winter increased the Cowboys' lead to 34 points, 40-6, on a five-yard touchdown run. With less than five minutes left in the game, Hoxie scored on another long run up the middle, as junior Toliver Bird ran 59 yards for a touchdown making the final score 40-12.

Coach Jon McLean said he was really proud of the players and pleased with their performance against the Indians. He said he was particularly pleased with the defense, saying the players hit hard and looked after their assigned responsibilities well.

All six of Goodland's touchdowns came on short runs of seven yards or less. The Cowboys scored six of the seven times they were in the "red zone," inside the 20-yard line.

The Cowboys' rushing attack produced 406 of the 448 total yards, with two players gaining over 100 yards on the ground. Winter led the way with 170 yards on 13 carries scoring one touchdown. Ravmer rushed 14 times for 103 yards and two touchdowns, and also scored on a two-point conversion.

Lohr, who scored three of Goodland's touchdowns, ran for 93 yards on 19 carries. Freshman running back Casey Henderson rushed ten times for 34 yards.

Raymer completed four of seven passes for 42 yards. Junior Jase Herl caught two of them for 21 yards. Seniors Drew Wilkens and David Livengood both caught one pass each, for 12 and nine yards respectively. There were no interceptions in the game.
