September 14, 1904: Oscar Edwards, the republican nomination for superintendent of schools, settled in the north part of this county in 1887.

Boy wouldn’t tell anyone how he got hurt

September 10, 1904: Boy Won’t Tell — How Ira Peters, young son of R. L. Peters, threw his wrist out of joint and bruised his head so that he could hardly move it from the pillow the next day is a mystery to everyone except himself.

His parents believe he fell out of the hay mow, but the boy won’t tell. Ira has been coaxed, but of no avail.

Influence has been brought to bear in the shape of cookies and crackers with jelly on them, but he keeps his own council as to how he got hurt.

Dr. Gulick was called to the Peters home, four miles north of town, to reduce the dislocation, and the boy is getting over his hurt.

September 11, 1904: H. C. Tagtmeyer, who was nominated at the republican county convention for surveyor, is an old timer.

He came here in the early days and settled in Voltaire township. Mr. Tagtmeyer is a good citizen, always busy on his farm or working at his trade. If elected, he will give strict attention to the duties of his office.

today in history

September 12, 1904: Senator Long Speaks Here — Hon. Chester I. Long of Medicine Lodge, United States senator from Kansas, in response to a communication from the republican central committee of this county, has accepted an invitation to speak in Goodland and will be here Saturday afternoon, Sept. 17.

The meeting will be held in the opera house at 2 o’clock sharp. All persons interested in politics, and those who will like to hear one of the best speakers in Kansas, are invited to be present.

September 13, 1904: Declamatory Contest — Pearl Kimmel to Represent This County at Norton Meeting — At Norton on September 14 and 15, the Women’s Christian Temperance Union of the Sixth

district will hold its 20th annual convention, and one of the features of the meeting will be a declamatory contest on the last day, the winner to be given a gold medal with an appropriate inscription.

The preliminary contest of Sherman county readers was held at the Methodist church Thursday evening, the contestants being Miss Pearl Kimmel, Miss Grace Germann and Crandall Goodrich..

The three judges gave their decision in favor of Miss Kimmel of Goodland, who will represent Sherman County at the Norton contest. To make up a larger program and to while away the time the judges were taking to make up their grades of the contests, selections were given by Mr. Wade Warner, B.O., Miss Eva White, and Mr. G.W. Sapp.

The next labor of the winner of the Goodland contest will be to capture the medal at the district meeting, and all Sherman county people
