September 15, 1904: Nearly All Were Successful — Out of Forty Seven Taking Examination Only Eight Failed — Larger Per Cent Passed in Sherman County Than Usual and Compares Favorably With Other Counties — The teachers’ examination at the high school building last week, for common school certificates, was taken by 47 candidates, and out of that number, 39 were successful. Only eight failed to make the required average for the certificate sought.

The board of examiners was highly pleased with the work done in the examination. The examinees put their “brains” on paper in good shape and were well-primed for the test in the month of institute work. Those successful were: Wade
