

Golfers second at Sugar Hills

The Cowgirls golf team finished second at the Goodland Invitational last Tuesday at Sugar Hills Golf Club.

Senior Amy Cebula led Goodland's first team with a 14-over-par 95, finishing second overall in the tournament. Freshman Sammie Raymer place fourth with a round of 100. Sophomore Hannah Burkett finished in a tie for 10th at 110 but placed 11th after a tie-breaker coin toss.

Other members of the first team were senior Bailee Guyer, who shot 112; senior Emily Burkett, 114; and junior Sami Philbrick, at 119.

"I thought the tournament went well," said coach Connie Livengood. "Some players turned in the personal best scores.

Senior Maggie Welch of Syracuse won the tournament with a 7-over-par 78. Welch placed third at the state Class 1-4A championship last year. Her teammate junior Cheyenne George finished third overall with 97.

The Lady Bulldogs of Syracuse won the tournament with a score of 396. Goodland's team shot a 421. Trego Community High was third with 437, followed by Hugoton with 444. Goodland's second team

was fifth with 462 and Scott City was sixth with 462.

The Cowgirls' second team was led by sisters Kelsey and Julie Leiker, who both shot a 112. Kelsey is a senior and Julie a junior. Sophomore Brooke Whitmore shot a 115, senior Ana McClung 123 and freshman Holly Kibel 139.

In junior varsity competition on the par 35 front nine, sophomore Stephanie Sheldon led the Cowgirls with a 60, sophomore Amber Webster and freshman Heidi Yonkey both shot 62, and sophomore Kerri Bellamy had a 68.

The Cowgirls were scheduled to play at a tournament, hosted by Thomas More Prep-Marian, Monday morning at the Smoky Hill Country Club in Hays. The junior varsity will be in action Thursday in Ulysses.

The next varsity action is at the Colby Country Club next Monday while the junior varsity plays in a tournament in Russell.

"Our team is continuing to improve," Livengood said, "but as the scores indicate, we will have to really work hard if we want to reach our goals."

Goodland runners compete at Wamego

Goodland sophomore Kerek Mason led the Cowboys again this weekend with a fourth-place medal at the Wamego Invitational on Saturday, finishing the 5,000-meter course in 17 minutes, 10 seconds.

Other Cowboys running were junior Brandon Zelfer, who finished 70th in 19 minutes, 26 seconds; senior Craig Mason, 81st in 19 minutes, 59 seconds; and freshman Toby Hurst, 92nd in 20 minutes, 17 seconds.

"Kerek Mason truly had an outstanding race," coach Don Smith said. "He was the top sophomore finisher in the race."

One hundred twenty-three runners from 20 schools in the boys 5,000 meters, about 3.1 miles, finished the race. Goodland was one of three teams that did not have enough runners for a team score.

Smith said both the boys and girls teams are fighting a variety of injuries, but there was nothing disappointing in the efforts of the runners Saturday.

Only two Cowgirls made the trip to Wamego. Sophomore Whitney Dautel was 44th in the girls two-

mile race, covering the distance in 13 minutes, 31 seconds. Junior Tiffany Thomas was 48th, just three seconds behind Dautel.

There were 115 girls from 19 schools competing in the race.

Colby junior Jessica Stephens won the girls race in 11 minutes, 59 seconds. The Lady Tigers of Clay Center won the team title with 47 points, led by sophomore Amy Pierson, who placed second in 12 minutes, 1 second. Baldwin High School from eastern Kansas was second with 96 points.

Senior Jay Lindal of Clearwater High School won the boys race in 16 minutes, 37 seconds. The Bulldogs of Baldwin won the team title with 61 points, led by junior Keith Cowart who placed third in 17 minutes, 3 seconds. The host Wamego High was second with 104 points.

The Cowboys and Cowgirls will compete at the Oakley Invitational this afternoon at 4 p.m. (Central Time). The event will be held at the Oakley Country Club.

"I would like the runners to get healthy," Smith said, "so we can do something as a team."

Brady Coen of Wiley, Colo., won the modified main race. Dwayne Dechant and Darren Deloach, both of Lamar, finished second and third. Lane Linthacum was 11th in the race.
