Cowboys corral Buffaloes, 50-6

The Goodland Star-News Two Indian attacks and a Buffalo herd have not hindered the Cowboys, as they continue along the trail back to the state playoffs.

Goodland defeated Rawlins County High School 50-6 Friday night in Atwood to keep the Cowboys unbeaten for the season. In the first half, the Goodland offense could not be stopped and the defense shut down the Buffaloes' attack.

"I was happy with our defense," said coach Jon McLean. "We had a good pass and good coverage. Our special teams played really well, giving us tremendous field position throughout the game."

The Cowboys surged out to a 21-0 lead in the first quarter on three touchdowns by senior fullback Brock Lohr, all on short runs. In the second quarter, Goodland score three more touchdowns.

The first was on a 5-yard pass play from senior quarterback Derrick Raymer to junior wide receiver Heath Chatfield about three minutes into the period

Six minutes later, with the Buffaloes on their own 1, senior nose guard Anthony Benavides tackled the quarterback in the end zone for a safety.

The second Cowboy touchdown of the quarter came about 45 seconds later on a two-yard run by senior tailback Lane Winter. The third came with 20 seconds left in the half on a 2-yard keeper by Raymer. Goodland led 43-0 at the half.

Because of the Cowboy's lead, officials implemented a continuous clock for the second half. During that time the game clock only stops during an officials' or team's time out, end of a quarter or for an injury.

For the second half, coach Mc-Lean started giving his back-up players some time. The two teams held each other scoreless for most of the third quarter until, with about 2 1/2 minutes left, Buffaloes' running end for a 33-yard touchdown.
