# Cowboys go after win No. 4 tonight against Red Devils

The Goodland Cowboys lost just two regular-season games last year. Last Friday, they whipped Rawlins County, then Atwood High School, 50-6 on the Buffaloes home turf to avenge one of the losses.  
Tonight, the Cowboys will get the chance to pay back the other team in front of a homecoming crowd at 6 p.m. in Cowboy Stadium when Decatur Community High School of Oberlin comes to town. Last season, at Oberlin's homecoming, the Red Devils trailed 19-7 at halftime, then came back to score a touchdown in the third quarter and one in the fourth while holding Goodland scoreless to win 20-19.  
Oberlin is 1-2 this season after losing to Oakley last Friday 36-28. The Red Devils lost their season opener to St. Francis 8-0 on Sept. 3 and defeated Quinter 32-0 two weeks ago.  
"Oberlin is a good, physical team," said Goodland coach Jon McLean. "They will not be afraid to hit us on defense, and they run their offense right at you."

McLean said the Red Devils run what is known as the "Maryland I," where the three running backs will line up vertically behind the quarterback to keep the defense guessing. He said all three of their backs are capable runners.  
The success of Goodland's ground attack has been a major factor in the Cowboy's 3-0 start this season. Senior fullback Brock Lohr has gained 281 yards on 59 carries and scored eight touchdowns.  
Senior quarterback Derrick Raymer has completed 15 of 25 passes for 235 yards and two touchdowns, with only one interception. He has run for 176 yards on 30 carries, scoring four touchdowns.  
Senior tight end Bret Jarmin is the team's leading receiver, with four catches for 104 yards and a touchdown. Junior Jase Herl and senior David Livengood both also have four receptions, for 62 and 31 yards, respectively.  
McLean said the offense has been executing better and has been able

to produce a more balanced attack with each game. He said the team has been trying to cut down on penalties and turnovers.  
Against Rawlins County, the Cowboys had just three penalties compared to 10 the week before against St. Francis. However, for the second straight week, they turned over the ball three times.  
On defense, McLean said, Herl is the leading tackler with 28, followed by Lohr with 21. He said Lohr calls the signals on defense and that Livengood takes over when he's not on the field. Raymer backs them up. McLean said one of those three will always be on the field on defense.  
McLean said Oberlin wide receiver Lance Fortin is a deep threat and will be a player to watch. He said the Cowboys defense have been working hard on improving their deep coverage this week. Three of the four touchdowns the Cowboys have allowed this season have been on plays of more than 50 yards. The fourth came on a 33-yard run last Friday.  
Goodland received some votes in this week's high school Class 4A rankings by the *Salina Journal*, as did the Ulysses Tigers who are also 3-0 for the season and will host the Cowboys on Oct. 8.



# Rawlins County, Healy sweep meets

The Lady Buffaloes of Rawlins County High School in Atwood went 2-0 Tuesday at the triangular meet at Wallace County High in Sharon Springs.  
Rawlins County opened the meet by defeating the Wallace County Wildcats 12-25, 25-18 and 25-16. Next, the Buffaloes beat Oakley 26-24 and 25-17. Oakley then defeated Wallace County 25-20 and 25-17.

Also on Tuesday, the Lady Eagles of Healy went 3-0 at a quadrangular meet at Grinnell High School. Healy defeated Quinter 25-12, 25-19; Triplains High of Winona 25-29, 25-12; and Grinnell 25-17, 20-25 and 25-22.  
Grinnell went 2-1, defeating Triplains 25-13, 25-7 and Quinter 25-11, 25-11. Quinter went 1-2 beating Triplains 25-22, 25-12.

Triplains finished 0-3 for the tournament.  
In junior varsity action in Grinnell, it was the host team that went 3-0, defeating Colby, Quinter and Healy. Quinter was 2-1, Colby 1-2 and Healy 0-3.

# Lady golfers third in Colby

Coach Connie Livengood divided the Cowgirls golf team into two squads Monday, with one placing third at a tournament in Colby and the other fifth at Russell.  
Sophomore Brooke Whitmore led the Cowgirls at Colby with a score of 59 on the par-36 nine-hole course at the Colby Country Club. Whitmore placed seventh overall in the tournament.  
Other top golfers for Goodland there were Ana McClung with 63, freshman Eryn Topliff with 66 and senior Kelsey Leiker with 67. Others playing in the varsity competition were sophomores Stephanie Sheldon (72) and Amber Webster (76).  
In the junior varsity competition, freshman Heidi Yonkey placed fifth

with a score of 67. Freshman Holly Kibel finished with a 69.  
The tournament champion was Maggie Welch of Syracuse, who won with a 5-over-par 41 and led the Lady Bulldogs to the team title. Trista Nordyke of Hugoton was second with 49 and Cheyenne George of Syracuse third with 50.  
Syracuse scored 205 with Hugoton second with 236. Goodland scored 255.  
Freshman Sammie Raymer led the Cowgirls at the Memorial Park Golf Course in Russell, finishing in a tie for fourth with a 13-over-par 49 for nine holes. Junior Julie Leiker was 17th with 58, junior Sami Philbrick 20th with 60 and sophomore Hannah Burkett 23rd with 63.

Other Cowgirls competing in Russell were senior Emily Burkett, who finished with a 66, and senior Amy Cebula with 68.  
Bailey Ponton of Minneapolis won the tournament with a 4-over-par 40. Kyrsten Woods of Larned was second with 47 and Hoisington's Paige Cooper third with 48.  
Trego Community High of Wa-Keeney won the team competition with a score of 211. The Golden Eagles had four of the top 15 players. Minneapolis finished second with 215 with Larned third just one stroke back. Hoisington earned fourth-place with 229 one stroke better than Goodland.  
The Cowgirls were to have played at a tournament in Scott City on Thursday. Their next action will be at 10 a.m. (Central Time) Tuesday at the Bentwood Golf Course in Ulysses.
