Coach Don Smith said he was pleased with everyone's effort at the meet. and lots of positive things came from the trip. He said every Goodland athlete, varsity and junior varsity, came away with at least one medal.

Sophomore Kerek Mason placed second in the boys race, finishing the 5,000-meter course, about 3.1 miles, in 17 minutes, 1 second. That was just five seconds behind Ulysses' Junior Medina.

The next four Cowboy finishers placed between 21st and 27th, and within 70 seconds of each other. Junior Brandon Zelfer finished 21st in 18 minutes, 57 seconds, senior Craig Mason was 23rd in 19 minutes, 20 seconds, freshman Dustin Pennington 26th in 19 minutes, 38 seconds and senior James Cearley 27th in 19 minutes, 45 seconds.
