

For the first time this season, both the Cowboys and Cowgirls cross country squads were able to compete as teams at the same meet Tuesday, and both finished third at the Ulysses Invitational.

Coach Don Smith said he was pleased with everyone's effort at the meet, and lots of positive things came from the trip. He said every Goodland athlete, varsity and junior varsity, came away with at least one medal.

Sophomore Kerek Mason placed second in the boys race, finishing the 5,000-meter course, about 3.1 miles, in 17 minutes, 1 second. That was just five seconds behind Ulysses' Junior Medina.

The next four Cowboy finishers placed between 21st and 27th, and within 70 seconds of each other. Junior Brandon Zelfer finished 21st in 18 minutes, 57 seconds, senior Craig Mason was 23rd in 19 minutes, 20 seconds, freshman Dustin Pennington 26th in 19 minutes, 38 seconds and senior James Cearley 27th in 19 minutes, 45 seconds.

"Craig ran one of the best races of his career," Smith said.

Freshman Toby Hurst was 33rd in 20 minutes, 5 seconds and senior Daniel Blake 41st in 20 minutes, 59 seconds.

Leading the way for the Cowgirls was sophomore Whitney Dautel, who placed sixth overall in 14 minutes, 21 seconds for the two-mile race. Junior Tiffany Thomas was 21 seconds behind, placing seventh overall.

Junior Kalie Smith finished 18th in 15 minutes, 21 seconds and earned

ing a medal in her first competitive race of the season. Sophomore Mara Sloan was 26th in 15 minutes, 56 seconds and junior Chelsea Ontiveroz was 31st in 16 minutes, 49 seconds.

The Trojans of Stanton County High School of Johnson City won the boys team title with 48 points followed by Dodge City with 56. Goodland's score was 99. The Lady Demons of Dodge City won the

girls title with 40 points, with Stanton County second with 58. Goodland scored 62.

Kristen Radcliff of Forgan High School of Oklahoma won the girls' race in 12 minutes 53 seconds.

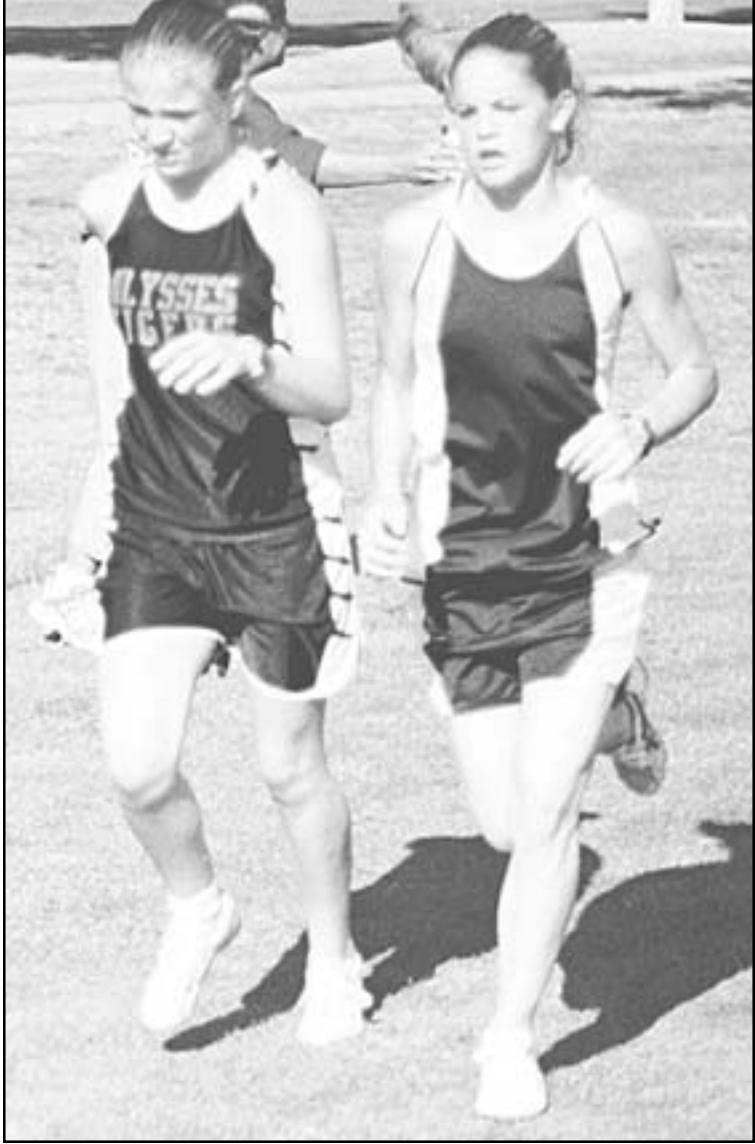
The top 20 runners and members of the top three teams in the varsity races earned medals, as did the top 10 runners in both the boys and girls junior varsity races.

For the Cowboys, freshman

Cody Bussen finished fifth in the junior varsity race in 22 minutes, 19 seconds. Freshman April Smith placed seventh in the girls race in 19 minutes, 47 seconds.

Smith said what pleased him most was that most of his runners were healthy and both the boys and the girls could compete as teams.

The runners face a challenge Saturday in Johnson City for what Smith described as "very, very com-



petitive" meet involving as many as 18 schools including Class 5 and 6A powers, and some teams from Colorado and Oklahoma.

Competition starts at 10 a.m. (Central Time). Johnson City is about 95 straight south of Goodland on K-27.

Girls place in top 10

The Lady Mustangs cross country team placed three runners in the top 10 Tuesday in the junior high girls race at the Ulysses Invitational.

Eighth-graders led the way for Grant Junior High, with Hannah Blake placing fifth and finishing the one-mile course in 6 minutes, 18 seconds. Brittaney Medrano was sixth, finishing just three seconds behind Blake. Cassie Cooper was eighth in six minutes, 30 seconds.

Other Lady Mustangs competing were eighth-graders Savannah Schlink (24th in 7:08), Hollie Langley (29th in 7:23) and Linsey Owens (32nd in 7:27). Seventh-graders were Alyssa Brady (33rd in 7:29), Angelica Medrano (37th in 7:41), Tania Arnold (38th in 7:45) and Jessi Geist (43rd in 7:57).

Madison Roberts of Ulysses Junior High won the race in 5 minutes, 55 seconds with her teammate Janni Meirerhoff three seconds behind her. Fifty-two runners from 10 schools competed in the race.

Seventh-grader Eric Ross finished 34th in the boys race in 7 minutes, 20 seconds, with teammate Tanner Oharah two seconds behind in 35th place.

Tyral Beltz of Hugoton won the race in 5 minutes, 45 seconds, nipping Kellum Schnider of Lakin at the tape. Forty-five runners from 11 schools took part.

Last Thursday, the Mustangs ran in the McCook Invitational. Blake led the Grant girls, placing fifth in 7 minutes, 16 seconds. Cooper was seventh and B. Medrano finished eighth. The Lady Mustangs also took 14th through 20th place for A. Medrano, Owens, Schlink, Langley, Arnold, Geist and Brady, in order.

Eighth-grader Austin Klemm led the Grant boys, finishing eighth in 7 minutes, 30 seconds. Ross was 12th and Oharah 13th.

"The runners did a great job representing Grant Junior High and Goodland," said coach Richard Schwasinger.

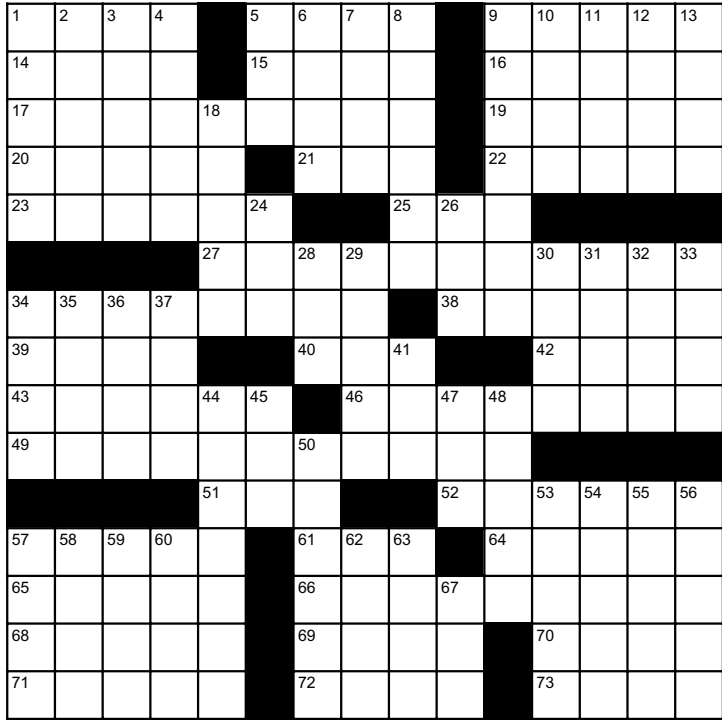
