Cowboy wins race

Goodland Sophomore Kerek Mason won the boys 5,000-meter race Saturday at the Stanton County Invitational in Johnson City, finishing in 16 minutes, 5 seconds.

Other top finishers for the Cowboys included junior Brandon Zelfer, who was 15th in 18 minutes, 4 seconds; freshman Dustin Pennington, 19th in 18 minutes, 12 seconds; senior Craig Mason, 20th in 18 minutes, 24 seconds; and senior James Cearley, 23rd in 18 minutes, 26 seconds.

Freshman Toby Hurst and senior Daniel Blake also ran for the varsity. Hurst finished 29th in 19 minutes, 2 seconds, while Blake 32nd in 19 minutes, 19 seconds.

The Cowboys finished third with 78 points. Dodge City won the team competition with 41 points, followed by Lamar, Colo., with 43. Ulysses was fourth, Scott City fifth and Hugoton sixth.

Junior Tiffany Thomas led the Cowgirls, finishing the two-mile course in 13 minutes, 18 seconds for 11th place. Sophomore Whitney Dautel was 12th just seven seconds behind Thomas. Junior Kalie Smith finished 17th in 14 minutes,.

Sophomore Mara Sloan was 33rd in 14 minutes, 35 seconds; junior Chelsea Ontiveroz 39th in 15 minutes, 25 seconds; and April Smith 44th in 19 minutes, 38 seconds.

Leticia Padilla of Hugoton won the race in 12 minutes, 27 seconds to lead the Lady Eagles to the team title with 51 points. Scott City was second with 59, Dodge City third with 75 and Lamar fourth with 92. The Cowgirls finished fifth with 112 points. Ulysses was sixth.

Junior varsity tennis action in Goodland on Thursday

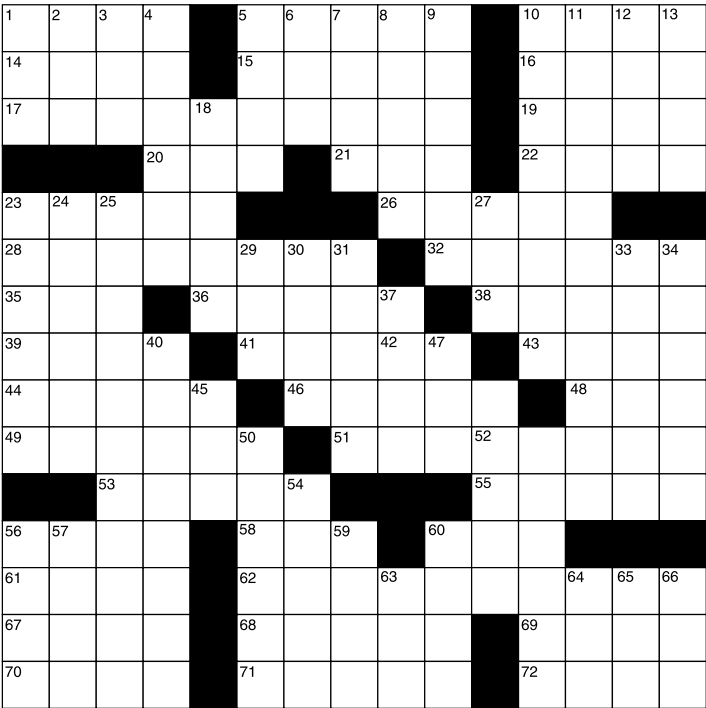
