

Couple returned from Sweden, brought six young people

October 1, 1904: Back From Sweden — Mr. and Mrs. Swan Nelson returned from a six months' visit to the old home scenes in Sweden.

Swan brought with him six young Swedes who will become citizens of this country. A good many years ago, Mr. Nelson came across the waters, and since then he has only an occasional opportunity to use his native tongue.

But he declares that when he got back to Sweden he had to learn over

again many of the ins and outs and forms of expression of the language.

Mrs. Nelson appears much benefited by the trip, as does also Mr. Nelson, for both had worked hard for a long time to get a good start in Sherman county. Now they are comfortably situated and do not have to contend with the obstacles that naturally beset the inhabitants of a new country.

October 2, 1904: Oakley Burned

Down — The town of Oakley, in Logan County, was almost completely destroyed by fire last Wednesday night.

The fire started in a hotel building and spread to all the business portion of the town. The post office, bank, stores and other structures were destroyed. The insurance covers a small part of the loss. Reconstruction of the business houses has already begun.

October 3, 1904: Take Notice — All persons hereafter disturbing the peace in the city limits by the discharge of firearms or causing explosions of any kind will be speedily dealt with according to ordinance regulation, imposing both fine and imprisonment. C.E. Swarts, Mayor

October 4, 1904: The little shepherd dog that is wont to sit on the seat of Donly & Scott's delivery wagon, and to assume a faithful air, was in a runaway all by himself last week.

The crack of the engine of a passing automobile scared the delivery horses. They were not tied, and the

faithful little dog was on the seat.

The team broke and ran north, but the dog sat undismayed. The first crossing was reached; the wagon bounded high, but the canine driver landed all right, and kept his seat.

The horses ran another block and over another crossing and finally slowed up and stopped at a house where accustomed to make deliveries., and no damage was done.

When the driver came running up, the little fellow jumped gaily about and wagged his tail in glee, as though he took in the situation fully and rejoiced at the happy outcome

with his master.

October 5, 1904: LOST — Oct. 2, between a point on section line north of March Middleton's and Kanorado, a black bill book about eight inches long, three inches wide, containing \$240; seven \$20s and ten \$10s. Finder will please return same to me and receive liberal reward.
