Volleyball team splits at home

The Cowgirls volleyball team split its matches Tuesday at Max Jones Fieldhouse, losing 2-0 to Dundy County High of Benkelman, Neb., then sweeping Greeley County of Tribune.

The Lady Tigers of Dundy County won the triangular meet's first match 25-15, 25-17 over the Lady Coyotes of Weskan.

In the first game of the second match, the Tigers got the first four points and did not let Goodland get any closer than two throughout the game winning 25-21.

The teams played even through most of the second game, with the score tied 16 times. With the score tied at 22 and sophomore Dani Bedore serving, the Cowgirls got the next two points, one on a service ace, and had two game points at 24-22. However, after a Dundy County timeout, the Tigers scored the next point after a long rally then, with senior Heather Morris serving, they scored the next three points to win 26-24.

After falling behind 3-0 in their

first game against Weskan, the Cowgirls fought back to tie the score at seven. Later, with the score tied at 13, Goodland scored eight of the next 10 points to lead 21-15. The Coyotes managed to close to within three at 23-20, but sophomore Whitney Archer got the next point for the Cowgirls on a kill. Then senior Aubrea Winter served up the winning point for a 25-20 victory.

In the second game, the Cowgirls jumped out to a 9-2 lead, maintaining at least a seven-point advantage throughout. Junior Melissa Swager served up the game's final five points to give Goodland the win 25-13.

Tuesday was senior parent's night, as the crowd recognized the team's three seniors and their parents for their hard work and dedication to Cowgirl volleyball. Honored were Winter and her parents, Gary and Deb; Ciara Abbey and parents, Mike and Lorie; and manager Chantel Thornburg and her parents Neal and Stacy.

The Cowgirls' next action begins at 9 a.m. (Central Time) Saturday at a tournament in Oakley.

Tennis team places sixth at Garden City Invitational

The Cowgirls finished sixth out of 12 tennis teams at the Garden City Invitational on Saturday.

Sophomore Jillian Parker took sixth in No. 1 singles, finishing with a 3-3 record. She defeated opponents from Ulysses, Meade and Cimarron high schools, but lost to the players from Hays and two Garden City teams.

Garden City fielded two squads, white and brown, for their home tournament.

Goodland's No. 2 doubles team, juniors Kali Rietcheck and Megan Stefan, also finished sixth with a 3-3 record, defeating the teams from Ulysses, Meade and Hays, and losing to Cimarron, Scott City and the Garden City white squad.

Sophomore Jena McCall finished seventh with a 3-3 record at No. 2 singles, defeating opponents

from Ulysses, Meade and Great Bend while losing to Hays, Garden City white and Cimarron. Her match against Cimarron went to a tie-breaker.

"Jena was competitive in every one of her matches," said coach Wallace Hansen. "This was her first time playing singles in a big meet."

Senior Grace Langness and sophomore Sandy Johnson teamed up to place eighth at No. 1 doubles, finishing 2-4 for the tournament. They defeated the teams from Ulysses and Meade and lost to Hays, Cimarron, Great Bend and Garden City white.

Hansen said the Cowgirls gave a creditable performance considering they played without normal sleep, attending Goodland's homecoming dance Friday, and then having to

leave at 5:30 a.m. the next morning.

Garden City's white squad won the tournament with 56 points, followed by Colby with 46 and Scott City third with 43. Cimarron and Hays tied for fourth with 35. Goodland scored 23 points.

Great Bend was seventh (20), Dodge City eighth (18), Garden City's brown squad ninth (17), Liberal tenth (14), Ulysses 11th (6) and Meade 12th (0).

Hansen said finishing ahead of Great Bend, Dodge City and Liberal was a positive thing for the team.

At a triangular meet on Sept. 23 in Tribune, McCall and Johnson won the gold medal for No. 1 doubles, winning both of their matches 7-3 against teams from Garden City and Greeley County.

Parker took second in No. 1 singles, needing a tie-breaker to beat her opponent from Garden City 7-6 (7-4) before losing to Greeley County 7-1.

The Cowgirls No. 2 doubles team

of sophomores Lauren Hill and Jessica Lu also took second. After losing to Garden City 7-5, the pair defeated Greeley County 7-6 (7-5).

Langness lost both of her matches, to Garden City 7-2 and to Greeley County 7-1, in No. 2 singles.

The Cowgirls placed second at the meet with 11 points. The Lady Jackrabbits of Greeley County won with 15 points, while Garden City scored six points.

The varsity played in Colby on Tuesday but results were not available. The Goodland Junior Varsity Invitational, which was rained out on Sept. 21, was to have been played Thursday. The final varsity meet before the regionals will be next Thursday in Scott City, and regionals will be the following Monday.

The Brewster High School volleyball team improved to 23-2 for the season with three wins at a home quadrangular meet Tuesday.

The Lady Bulldogs defeated Triplains High School of Winona 25-10, 25-8; Greeley County High of Tribune 25-27, 25-10; and Wallace County High of Sharon Springs 25-18, 23-25 and 25-18.

"We didn't look quite as sharp as we have," said coach Lynda McKee, "but we were still able to come away with three wins. Illness was a contributing factor to our play; hopefully we'll be healthy next week."

Brewster will be in Oberlin on Tuesday for a quadrangular meet with Goodland, Rawlins County and the host Decatur Community

High.

The Bulldogs are on a seven-match win streak since Sept. 11, when they won a tournament in La Crosse, defeating the host team in the title match after losing to the Lady Leopards earlier in the day.

McKee said she was proud of her team's effort in that tournament, saying the players were able to keep their focus after struggling against La Crosse in pool play.

The Bulldogs, who have lost only one game in their last seven matches, remain ranked No. 5 this week, tied with Little River High School, in Class 1A by the Kansas Volleyball Association after breaking into the top five last week in a tie for the fifth spot with Western Plains High of Ransom.
