

New attraction adds to fly-in; good weather draws big crowds

Saturday's Fly-In at the Colby airport drew a crowd, thanks to good weather and a new attraction — skydiving.

"I think it went real well....," said airport manager Mark Ostmeyer. "We had a good turnout."

More than 300 people ate breakfast at the airport, provided by Boy Scout Troop 144.

Forty-four people took advan-

tage of tandem skydiving provided by Denver Skydivers out of Brush, Colo. There was no skydiving last year, but it proved to be an attraction this year, Ostmeyer said.

He said also helping draw the crowds were the 34 aircraft on display.

Two of the airplanes were jets, including a French Fouga Magistar fighter trainer. Several companies

and many individuals brought in their own aircraft to show off and later gave rides.

Ostmeyer said the numbers were down from last year's 50-55 planes and helicopters. He said there were no military craft on display because none of the invited groups came.

He added that attendance for the day was similar to last year, but he didn't have any solid figures yet.

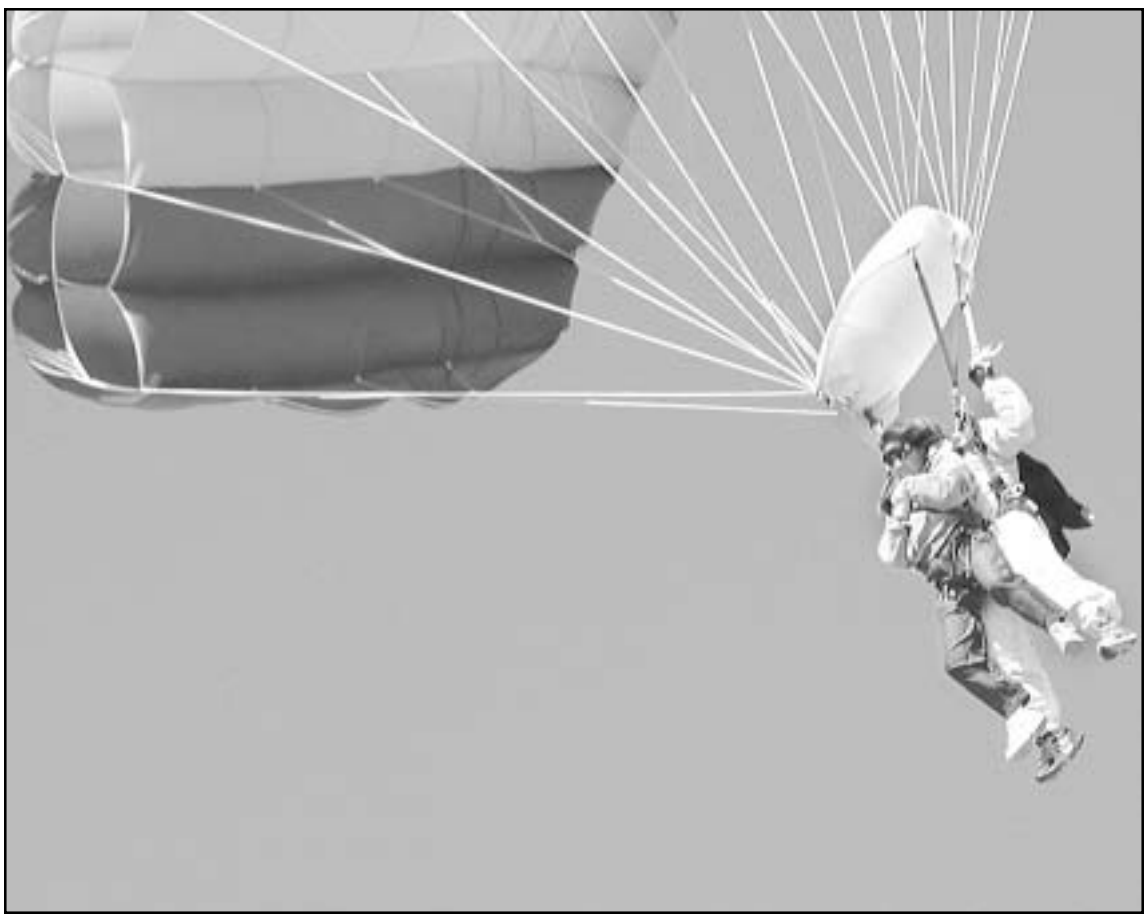
