Forecasters gather for meeting here

The Goodland Star-News Roughly 50 meteorologists will gather in Goodland next week for the High Plains Meteorological Conference, talking about everything from thunderstorms to snowstorms.

The three-day conference will be held at the Murray Center on the campus of the Northwest Kansas Technical College starting Wednesday.

The High Plains Chapter of the American Meteorological Society and the National Weather Association, two professional meteorological groups, have sponsored the yearly conference for the past eight years. The meeting rotates among weather station sites at Dodge City, Hastings and North Platte, Neb., and Goodland.

The conference is geared towards weather research and forecasting for the High Plains, which includes roughly the western half of Kansas and Nebraska.

Chapter President Bruce Entwistle, Science and Operations Officer for the National Weather Service in Goodland, said the conference will draw meteorologists, students and weather enthusiasts from the area, including the four National Weather Service offices.

He said with the nearest professional weather community at least three hours away, the conference will not only help participants learn more about their jobs, but it will give them an opportunity to socialize.

"It's a chance for people to come together and rub elbows," he said, "to build a weather community."

Along with talks from meteorologists at the Goodland National Weather Service office, students

and keynote speakers will give preentations.

The conference starts at 8 a.m. Wednesday with registration, and continues until noon Friday. Entwistle said they will look at forecasting, radar and climatology, or long-term weather patterns.

He said one of the presenters will use modern tools to take a second look at a historical tornadoes in Grand Island, Neb. in 1980. Another presentation will look at using a scale of severity, like the ones used to rate hurricanes, to rate winter storms.

One of the keynote speakers, Greg Stumpf with the Cooperative Institute for Mesoscale Meteorology Studies and the National Weather Service Meteorological Development Laboratory, will demonstrate developments in radar technology.

Entwistle said he is looking forward to a public presentation from keynote speaker Nolan Doesken, assistant state climatologist in Colorado. He will cover the recent drought in the High Plains and how it stacks up against historic droughts. The open presentation will be held at 7 p.m. Thursday at the college.

"Nolan is a very engaging speaker." he said.

The conference will feature a student paper competition, with scholarship prizes awarded to the top three

After hours, the clubs will hold a dinner at the Howard Johnson Hotel at 7 p.m. Wednesday and a dinner at the technical college at 5:30 p.m. Thursday.

Three meteorologists from the Goodland weather service plan to present papers at the conference, with almost everyone else taking some time out to attend.
