

Bulldogs bite Cowgirls at Oberlin quad meet

The Goodland Cowgirls went 1-2 at a quadrangular meet in Oberlin on Tuesday, defeating Rawlins County High of Atwood and losing to Decatur Community and Brewster high schools.

The Cowgirls lost their first two matches to Brewster 25-20, 20-25 and 25-20, and to Oberlin 25-22, 25-21. Goodland later beat Atwood 25-17, 21-25 and 25-20.

The Lady Bulldogs of Brewster went 1-2, defeating Goodland then losing 25-21, 25-18 to Rawlins County. In their next match, the Dawgs faced the host team, Decatur Community, losing 25-23, 25-22.

"This was a very competitive quad," said Brewster coach Lynda McKee. "The matches were even throughout. Even though we took two losses, it was a good experience for us."

The Lady Red Devils came out on top, going 3-0, including a 25-22, 22-25 and 25-21 win over Atwood.

The Cowgirls varsity will in action again Tuesday at a quadrangular meet in Oakley. The junior varsity and C teams will compete in a tournament in Hays on Saturday.

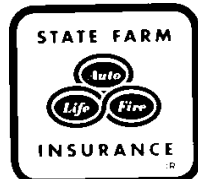
