

# Cowboys face unbeaten Tigers tonight

For the second time in a week, the Goodland High football team will play in a game between unbeaten teams.  
The Cowboys may be facing their toughest opponent of the regular season tonight at 7:30 p.m. (Central Time) when they face the Ulysses Tigers at Tiger Stadium. Both teams are 5-0, and both are listed among the top teams in Class 4A by the *Wichita Eagle* and the *Topeka Capital-Journal*.

Last Friday, the Cowboys fell behind but came back to beat the Oakley Plainsmen 22-8. Oakley scored a touchdown in the final seconds of the first quarter to take an 8-0 lead, but in the second, Goodland senior quarterback Derrick Raymer ran in from 11 yards out for a touchdown. Raymer also ran in the two-point conversion to tie the game at 8.

The tie was broken with the second play of the second half when senior tailback Lane Winter took the ball and outran the Oakley defense for 85 yards and a touchdown. Senior fullback Brock Lohr ran in for the two-point conversion to make the score 16-8.

The Cowboys added another touchdown in the fourth quarter when Raymer connected with senior David Livengood for a 20-yard pass play to increase Goodland's lead to 22-8.

The Cowboys victory over the Plainsmen was one of the feature stories in this week's *Kansas Preps Weekly*. Coach Jon McLean said he wanted to see how his team reacted to adversity, and was impressed how they responded after falling

behind.

While the Cowboys were winning in Oakley, Ulysses was keeping its unbeaten streak going by dominating the Monarchs of Thomas More Prep-Marian 57-7 in the Tigers' Homecoming game.

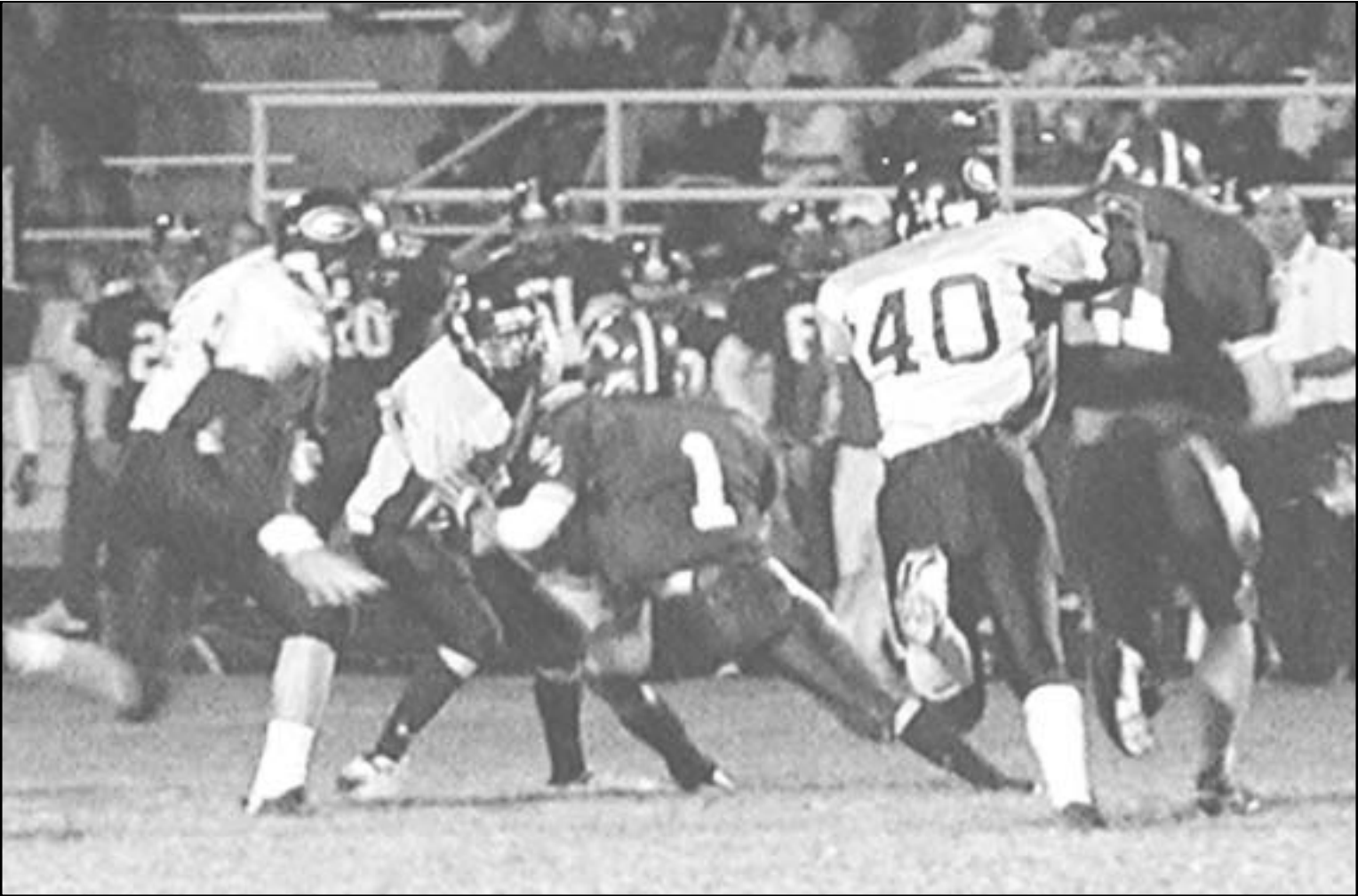
One difference between the two teams is that all five of the Cowboys' victories have been over teams that ranked in Class 1 or 2A, while two of Ulysses' wins were against Class 5A schools and two over other Class 4A teams.

McLean said this was one of the reasons why he was glad the Oakley game came the week before Ulysses, so that his players could have a tough test just before facing their strongest opponent.

McLean said Ulysses has a balanced offense that is effective both running and passing the ball. He said both senior running back Jesus Alvarado and sophomore quarterback Johnny Sosa have speed and quickness and are elusive. McLean said the Tigers also have good receivers.

"Doing a good job tackling will be the key for us," McLean said. "We're going to have to cover all aspects of the field on defense, and have to watch out for the big play."

Two players McLean is counting on in this game are senior Brandon Cowan and junior Mark Starr.

McLean said both have done an exceptional job on both the offensive and defensive lines.

The task of stopping Goodland's offense falls to a solid Ulysses defensive unit that returns five starters, including all three linebackers, from last year's 8-2 team.

The Cowboys rushing attack is led by Brock Lohr with 592 yards on 110 carries and 12 touchdowns. Winter is next has 345 yards on 37 carries and three touchdowns.

Raymer has completed 20 of 35 passes for 295 yards. He has passed for three touchdowns and thrown

three interceptions. He has rushed for 197 yards on 55 carries scoring six touchdowns.

Senior David Livengood is the team's leading receiver with six catches for 70 yards and a touchdown. Senior Bret Jarmin has five receptions for 120 yards and a

touchdown, and junior Jase Herl has four catches for 62 yards.

Next Friday, the Cowboys journey to Clay Center for a district game with the another gang of Tigers. Clay Center is 3-2 for the season and tonight will play the Wamego Red Raiders, also 3-2.

## Cowgirl golfers finish fourth at Lakin

The Cowgirls golf team finished fourth Saturday at the Lakin Invitational at the Lakin Municipal Golf Course.

Sophomore Hannah Burkett led Goodland with a round of 104 for 18 holes. Freshman Sammie Raymer was next with a 108, followed by senior Bailee Guyer with 110 and senior Amy Cebula with 112. Juniors Sami Philbrick and Julie Leiker finished with 118.

"Lakin was a tough day for us as a team and as individuals," coach

Connie Livengood said. "Hannah finished 11th and shot her personal best, this is the third time she just missed medaling."

Senior Maggie Welch of Syracuse won the tournament with a 76 to lead her team to a second-place finish. The host team, Lakin High School, won the tournament with a score of 402, four strokes better than Syracuse. The Lady Broncs had three players in the top 10.

Ulysses took third with a 410, followed by Goodland with 434.

Trego Community High of W-Keeney was fifth, Hugoton sixth, Larned seventh and Sublette eighth. Holcomb had two players, but four are needed for a team score.

The Cowgirls were to have played in Syracuse on Thursday in their final competition before the regional tournament on Monday at the Bentwood Golf Course in Ulysses.

"The regional is going to be tough as far as the competition goes," said Livengood, "We know what we have to do in order to play well at Ulysses and get our team to the state tournament. It will be up to the individual players and that is what is
