The Cowboys may be facing their toughest opponent of the regular season tonight at 7:30 p.m. (Central Time) when they face the Ulysses Tigers at Tiger Stadium. Both teams are 5-0, and both are listed among the top teams in Class 4A by the Wichita Eagle and the Topeka Capital-Journal.

Last Friday, the Cowboys fell behind but came back to beat the Oakley Plainsmen 22-8. Oakley scored a touchdown in the final seconds of the first quarter to take an 8-0 lead, but in the second, Goodland senior quarterback Derrick Raymer ran in from 11 yards out for a touchdown. Raymer also ran in the two-point conversion to tie the game at 8.

The tie was broken with the second play of the second half when senior tailback Lane Winter took the ball and outran the Oakley defense for 85 yards and a touchdown. Senior fullback Brock Lohr ran in for the two-point conversion to make the score 16-8.

The Cowboys added another touchdown in the fourth quarter when Raymer connected with senior David Livengood for a 20-yard pass play to increase Goodland's lead to 22-8.
