The lesson at the meeting was on antimicrobial resistance and food supply, referring to bacterial growths. Terms we should know are:

• Antibiotic, a chemical substance produced by a microorganism that can kill or inhibit the growth of another organism. One type of antimicrobial agent.

• Antimicrobial, a substance that kills microorganisms or suppresses their multiplication or growth. It may be naturally produced or made synthetically and includes antibiotics.

• Subtherapeutic, an amount of a drug given that is below the level needed to cure the infection.

• Virus, minute infectious agent without independent metabolism, requiring living host cells.
