

# Cowboys hit the trail again to hunt Tigers

Despite being bitten by the Ulysses Tigers last week 34-20, the Goodland Cowboys will be on another Tiger hunt tonight in Clay Center.

Goodland will take its 5-1 record to Otto Unruh Stadium to face the 3-3 Tigers of Clay Center Community High School in the first District 15 game for both teams. The stadium is west of Clay Center on U.S. 24. Kickoff is 6:30 p.m. (Central Time). Goodland radio KLOE (730 AM) will broadcast the game beginning around 5:05 p.m. (Mountain Time).

Clay Center, a member of the North Central Kansas League, lost 44-27 last Friday to the Wamego Red Raiders.

Coach Jon McLean said Clay Center is an option-dominated team that uses a lot of different formations and motion to try and confuse an opponent's defense. He said the Tigers have small, quick running backs who will be hard to see sometimes, and that makes running the option more effective.

Although Clay Center is only 3-

3 for the season, McLean is not taking the Tigers for granted. He said their schedule has been dominated by Class 4A teams and their losses were to good teams.

McLean said the key to the Cowboys success tonight is to be disciplined on defense and knowing which player is where in order to try and anticipate what Clay Center will do.

Defensively, the Tigers will have to try and stop an offense that has proved its ability to run the football and score points. Even in the Cowboys' one loss, they outrushed their opponent and scored three touchdowns, two on offense and one on a kickoff return.

Leading Goodland's rushing attack is senior fullback Brock Lohr

with 661 yards on 129 carries. He has scored 13 touchdowns, all on

the ground. The Cowboys' second-leading rusher is senior tailback

Lane Winter with 388 yards on 43 carries; he has three touchdowns.

Calling the signals for Goodland is senior quarterback Derrick Raymer, who has completed 26 of 56 passes for 395 yards. He has thrown for three touchdowns and been intercepted five times. Raymer is third on the team's rushing list with 315 yards on 69 carries and seven rushing touchdowns.

Senior David Livengood leads Goodland's receiving corps with seven catches for 72 yards and a touchdown. Senior Bret Jarmin has six receptions for 136 yards and a touchdown. Junior Jase Herl has caught five passes for 81 yards. Senior Drew Wilkens, Winter, and juniors Heath Chatfield and Bobby Miller each have two receptions for the season. Chatfield caught the team's other touchdown pass.

Livengood leads the team in kickoff returns with seven for 208 yards, including an 88-yard return for a touchdown last week against Ulysses.

McLean said he is confident the team can return home with a win as long as it plays well, executes on offense and the defense figures out Clay Center's offense.

## Golf team takes fifth at regionals

The Goodland Cowgirls finished fifth at the regional golf tournament Monday at the Bentwood Golf Course in Ulysses, but won't be sending anybody to the state tournament Monday in Salina.

"I was disappointed in the results at the tournament," said coach Connie Livengood. "Our girls have done better and have beaten some of the other teams before at various tournaments earlier this season."

Freshman Sammie Raymer led the Cowgirls with a 30-over-par 112. The other top players for Goodland were senior Emily Burkett with 122 and seniors Amy Ceb-

ula and Bailee Guyer, who both finished with 123. Senior Kelsey Leiker and sophomore Hannah Burkett both finished with 127.

Senior Maggie Welch of Syracuse won the tournament with a round of 83 while leading the Lady Bulldogs to a first-place finish with a team score of 420. Melissa Brown of Sublette High School finished second with 97 and will advance to the state championship as an individual.

The Lady Broncs of Lakin High were second with 436. Ulysses was third with 445 followed by Hugoton with 462. Goodland's score was

480. Other teams competing were Holcomb, Sublette and Scott City.

The top two teams and top five individuals who are not a member of the top two teams qualify for the state tournament. The Class 1-4A state championships will begin at 9 a.m. (Central Time) Monday at the Salina municipal golf course.

"It is unfortunate for our team that no one is going to state," Livengood said, "however, the girls had a good season. Anyone who has ever played golf knows that sometimes the game is not as easy on some days as it is on others."
