The Goodland Star-News The Goodland High School volleyball team will enter the Class 4A substate tournament next Saturday with something they haven't had since Sept. 11 — a winning record. The Cowgirls won the Northwest Kansas League tournament Saturday in Oberlin, taking four of their five matches and improving to 18-

16 for the season. It was a long, tough path to the championship as four of their matches went to three games. Goodland started with a 2-0 win

over Colby to start play in Pool B, in the junior high gym, then suffered their only loss 2-1 to Rawlins County High School of Atwood. The Cowgirls then beat a stubborn St. Francis team 2-1 to finish second in pool play.

With no time to rest Goodland took on Oakley, the winner of Pool A, in the tournament's first semifinal match beating the Lady Plainsmen 2-1. The Cowgirls then faced a rematch with Rawlins County for the title. The Lady Buffaloes beat Decatur Community High of Oberlin 2-0 in the other semi-final.

In the title match Goodland won the first game and Rawlins County the second then with the score tied at 23 in the third, the Cowgirls took the next two points for the game, match and championship.

In pool play, the Cowgirls began with a 2-0 win over the Lady Eagles of Colby, taking both games 25-16. In the first game, with the score tied at 3, Goodland scored seven straight points behind the serving skills of junior Melissa Swager to take a 7point lead. The Eagles could get no closer than six points after that, losing 25-16.

Colby was a bit tougher early on in the second game, but with the score tied at 5, the Cowgirls got eight straight points, with at least four of them coming off the power of sophomore Dani Bedore's jump serve. After that, Goodland kept the lead. With the score 20-16, the Cowgirls scored five straight to earn the win.

In the first game of Goodland's second match, against Rawlins County, the teams played to a 10-all tie before the Cowgirls took charge



and won 25-18.

In the second game, the teams battled to a 19-all tie, then it was the Buffaloes' turn to take charge, winning six of the next seven points for a 25-20 victory. The Cowgirls took a 6-2 lead early in the third game, but Rawlins County fought back to tie at 15. Later, with the score tied at 17, the Buffaloes scored three straight then held off Goodland to win 25-22. In the first game of the final match in pool play, the Lady Indians of St. Francis surprised Goodland by winning their only game of the tournament 25-23.
