

Goodland faces potent aerial attack tonight

One of the things players, coaches and fans will find out at tonight's game at Cowboy Stadium is whether Goodland's defense can stop the Concordia Panthers' aerial attack in the second game of district play.

The top two teams in each district advance to bi-district playoffs Nov. 2, and the Cowboys have a leg up after defeating Clay Center last week. Next week, the Colby Eagles come to town to close the regular season.

Although only 3-4 for the season, Concordia proved it can score points with a 64-36 win over Colby last week. Five of Concordia's 10 touchdowns came on plays of over 50 yards, including a 74-yard pass play and an 86-yard kickoff return.

Cowboy coach Jon McLean said the Panthers have an high-powered offense that is capable of producing the big play. Their passing attack is their strength, he said. Concordia quarterback Eric Gilliland is fourth in the state in passing yards, with 942 as reported by this week's issue of *Kansas Preps Weekly*.

Two Panther players are among state's leaders in receiving. Brice Vignery is fifth in the state with 420 yards on 24 catches. Jason Trent is ranked 21st with 274 yards on 15 catches.

Concordia's three wins have come from the Panthers' ability to score rather than their ability to stop their opponents on defense. They allowed Colby to score 36 points last Friday.

"Unless we shoot ourselves in the foot," McLean said, "we should be able to get into the end zone."

yards, accounting for 84 percent of the team's rushing total. The Cowboys take on the Concordia Panthers at 6 p.m. tonight at Cowboy Stadium.

Concordia will have to try to stop a Cowboy rushing attack that has gained over 1,800 yards already this season, led by senior fullback Brock Lohr with 839 yards on 170 carries and scoring 16 touchdowns. Senior

tailback Lane Winter has run 43 times for 373 yards and scored three touchdowns. Freshman Casey Henderson has 122 yards on 18 carries and a touchdown.

Senior quarterback Derrick Ray-

mer has completed 30 of 65 passes for 448 yards and five touchdowns. He has been intercepted six times. Raymer also has proven himself on the ground, running the ball gaining 346 yards on 80 carries and, perhaps

most important, scoring seven touchdowns.

Senior tight end Bret Jarmin leads the team in receptions with eight, gaining 153 yards and catching three of Raymer's touchdown

passes. Senior wingback David Livengood has seven catches for 72 yards and a touchdown. Junior Jason Herl has six receptions for 81 yards.

Lohr, in his role as linebacker, leads the Cowboy defense with 59 tackles and a fumble recovery. Not far behind is Herl; as a defensive back and special teams player he has 52 tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery, which he returned 14 yards for a touchdown against St. Francis. He also blocked a punt last week against Clay Center which was run in for a touchdown.

As a defensive lineman, Jarmin has 47 tackles and is the team's sack leader with four. He has intercepted one pass, which he returned 12 yards and recovered two fumbles.

Senior Drew Wilkens is the Cowboys' top pass defender, intercepting two passes and breaking up nine others. He has 22 total tackles. As a receiver Wilkens has caught three passes for 79 yards. He also has returned eight punts for 56 yards.

The Cowboys, 6-1 for the season, have outscored their opponents 245 to 76 and have outgained them on offense by more than 800 yards.

Two area of concern for McLean are turnovers and penalties. Goodland is even in total turnovers, taking away 12 fumbles and seven interceptions while giving up 13 fumbles and six interceptions. The Cowboys have been penalized 45 times for 445 yards, compared to just 26 times for 203 yards for their opponents.

Tonight is the first of a two-game home stand that end Goodland's regular season with. The Cowboys will play host to the Colby Eagles next Thursday in the last of their three district games.
