This accident on Oct. 20, 1943, took the life of Wilma's first husband, Edward "Les" Lantron, who was the belly turret gunner on the B-17. Out of a crew of 10, five crewmen were killed in the crash, and five bailed out, four of them being

captured by the Germans and held prisoners until the end of the war in 1945.

One crewman was able to make it back to England after several months.

Anyway, Mr. deSwart was able to have a memorial ceremony on the 60th anniversary of the crash, and after finding out that Wilma and Curtis existed, he wanted them to have a video of the affair and also some other mementos.

It was a very interesting afternoon, and I enjoyed hearing of the effort it took to present this remembrance for one of the battles of World War II.

Regional Medical Center and then flown to Children's Hospital in Denver, where she underwent surgery on Sunday. Her condition Monday was reported as being in fair condition.

The first ambulance arrived at the accident about 12:27 p.m., and re-

ported that one of the victims was on cardio-pulmonary resuscitation. The ambulance headed to the hospital at 12:31 a.m. A police escort waiting at the city limits lead the way, but Klinge was declared dead at the emergency room.

The second ambulance arrived a few minutes later and headed to the hospital at 12:54 carrying Bahe and

Normandin. The third was moving with Milke and Christians by 1:04 a.m.

Whitson said the cause of the accident is under investigation, but there was no indication of alcohol involved.

He said the speed of the car hadn't been fixed, but it appears to have been high. Unconfirmed reports put

the speed between 90-110 mph.

There was a report that Bahe had swerved to miss something when he lost control of the car, but Whitson said that has not been determined.

Normandin, son of Neil and Roberta Normandin, was released from the hospital that night, while Milke, daughter of Danyale Nothdurft, was kept overnight.
