

# Cowboys ready to stop Eagles Thursday

While some fans, and maybe a few players and a coach or two, might say records do not matter when it is Goodland versus Colby in football, the facts are that the Cowboys are 7-1 and the Eagles 3-5 this season.

Another fact is that the Cowboys, with a 2-0 record in district play, will be going on to play in the state tournament, whatever happens this week, and the Eagles, at 0-2, won't.

Both teams end their regular season Thursday at Cowboy Stadium, with the kickoff scheduled for 6 p.m.

Colby started its season winning three of four, but since then has lost four straight, including Friday's 33-14 trouncing by the Clay Center Tigers. Four of Colby's five losses are to teams the Cowboys have

beaten.

That is not to say coach Jon McLean should start his second string against Colby. The Eagles have sophomore running back Sam Munderloh, one of Kansas' top 25 rushers.

"Colby is a very young team that hasn't done well against the two other district opponents," McLean said, "but because of the rivalry, we had better be ready to play. It will be an exciting game."

Perhaps the biggest challenge for Colby will be to get its defense, which has given up 97 points in its last two games, to stop the Cowboys' rushing attack.

That ground game is led by senior fullback Brock Lohr, who has 1,008

yards on 201 carries so far this season. He ran 31 times for 163 yards against Concordia on Friday, scoring three touchdowns. Lohr has 19 six-pointers for the season, all on the ground.

Joining Lohr in the backfield is senior tailback Lane Winter, second on the team's rushing list with 441 yards on 49 carries and three touchdowns. Senior quarterback Derrick Raymer is third with 438 yards on 95 carries and eight touchdowns.

Opening the way for the ball carriers is the Cowboys' offensive line, comprising seniors Dexter Deeds, Blake Saint and Brandon Cowan, along with junior Mark Starr and sophomore John Mosbarger.

McLean said they played great against the Panthers Friday night, especially in the second half, when they allowed the Cowboy runners to gain eight of 10 yards per carry.

Raymer has completed 35 of 73 passes for 548 yards and six touch-

downs this year, with seven interceptions. Senior wingback David Livengood has 10 receptions, including a touchdown, for 141 yards to lead the Cowboys. Senior tight end Bret Jarmin has eight catches for 173 yards and four touchdowns, including one for 20 yards against Concordia on Friday.

As a team, the Cowboys have rushed for 2,139 yards, nearly 80 percent of Goodland's total offense of 2,737. The team has outgained its opponents by more than 1,100 yards for the season and outscored them 283-87.

The Cowboys' defense has allowed 1,020 yards rushing and 625 yards passing. Leading Goodland's

defensive effort is Lohr is his role as linebacker, with 68 tackles. Junior defensive back Jase Herl has 55 tackles and five broken up passes. He also has a fumble recovery for a touchdown and blocked a punt which was returned for a touchdown.

The bi-district playoff will be next Tuesday against an opponent from District 16, which includes Hugoton, Larned, Scott City and Ulysses. Which team and where will be determined after this week's games. Goodland's only loss this season was to the Ulysses Tigers, 34-20 on Oct. 8. That was their only game against a District 16 team.

In district play, the Cowboys are 2-0, while both Clay Center and Concordia are 1-1 and Colby is 0-2. The winner of the Clay Center/Concordia game also will advance to the bi-district playoffs.

## Cowboy, Lady Wildcat advance to state cross country meets

Sophomore Kerek Mason will represent Goodland High School at the Kansas Class 4A championship meet Saturday at the Wamego County Club.

Mason finished fifth at the regional meet Saturday at Prairie Hills Middle School in Hutchinson, running the 5,000-meter course in 16 minutes, 31 seconds.

The Cowboys finished sixth out of the 14 teams.

Other top runners for the Cowboys were junior Brandon Zelfer, who finished 33rd in 18 minutes, 3 seconds; senior Craig Mason, 37th in 18 minutes, 10 seconds; freshman Dustin Pennington; 46th in 18 minutes, 29 seconds; and senior James Cearley, 52nd in 18 minutes, 35 seconds.

Other Goodland runner in the boys race were senior Daniel Blake, who finished 64th in 19 minutes, 11 seconds, and junior Zach Breininger, 71st in 19 minutes, 51 sec-

onds.

In the girls two-mile race, junior Tiffany Thomas was 31st in 13 minutes, 17 seconds; sophomore Whitney Dautel 40th in 14 minutes, 28 seconds; and junior Chelsea Ontiveroz 75th in 16 minutes, 52 seconds.

Coach Don Smith said he was proud of the team's competitive spirit and positive attitude, especially Blake and Ontiveroz, who competed despite of nagging injuries.

Smith said Pennington had his best high school performance yet and it may have Zelfer's best as well. He said Craig Mason's effort was right with his career best.

Jay Lindal of Clearwater won the boys race in 15 minutes, 25 seconds and Mallory Champa, also of Clearwater, won the girls' in 11 minutes, 10 seconds.

Buhler High School, the host school, won both the boys' and

girls' team titles, with Clearwater placing second in both. The boys of Collegiate High School of Wichita were third, as were the Lady Eagles of Colby.

The top three teams advance to the state meet, and the top 10 individual runners also advance, of which at least five must come from teams other than the top three.

In the Class 1A regional meet at the Meade Golf Course on Saturday, junior Kalie Smith of Wallace County High School in Sharon Springs placed eighth in the girls' two-mile race finishing in 14 minutes, 11 seconds, qualifying for the state meet, which also will held Saturday in Wamego.

Sophomore Mara Sloan also competed for the Lady Wildcats, finishing 19th in 16 minutes, 44 seconds.

The boys Class 4A race will start at 11 a.m. (Central Time) and the girls Class 1A race at 11:30.

## Coyotes devour Bulldogs, 54-7

No team facing the Weskan Coyotes this season has figured out a way to stop Beau Cox, and the Brewster High was no exception Friday night in a 54-7 home loss.

Brewster was minus quarterback Branson Gilley, who is out after separating ribs last week and is also one of the Bulldog's leading tacklers. The 'Dawgs were not able to move the ball effectively inside the 20, while Weskan rushed for 373 yards in the game, which ended at half-time.

Brewster threatened a couple of times. Heath Baird found Paul Flanders for 53 yards, but Flanders

was ruled out of bounds at the one foot line and the 'Dawgs couldn't move the ball over the goal.

Baird found Jake Long for 33 yards and a first-and-goal at the 3 with 3:20 left in the first quarter, but Brewster couldn't cross the line this time either.

Brewster's only touchdown came from Baird to Long on a nine-yard pass with 4:15 left in the second quarter. Josh Ryan kicked the extra point.

Baird and Long combined at 12-for-29 for 199 yards and a touchdown, but three interceptions and minus seven yards rushing doomed Brewster.

Baird had three catches for 66

yards and a touchdown. Long had three catches for 33 yards. Ryan had three catches for 38 yards. Kyle O'Connor had two catches for nine yards. Paul Flanders had a single catch for 53 yards.

Long led the defense with seven tackles. O'Connor had six and an assist. Tyler Johnson, Cory Grantz, Ryan and Garrett Smith had one each. Ryan had two assists and Johnson had one.

Brewster is now 4-3 and ends its regular season on Thursday night when the Cheylin Cougars come to town. Game time is 7:30 (Central Time).

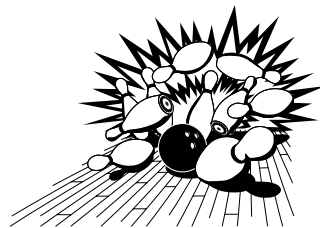

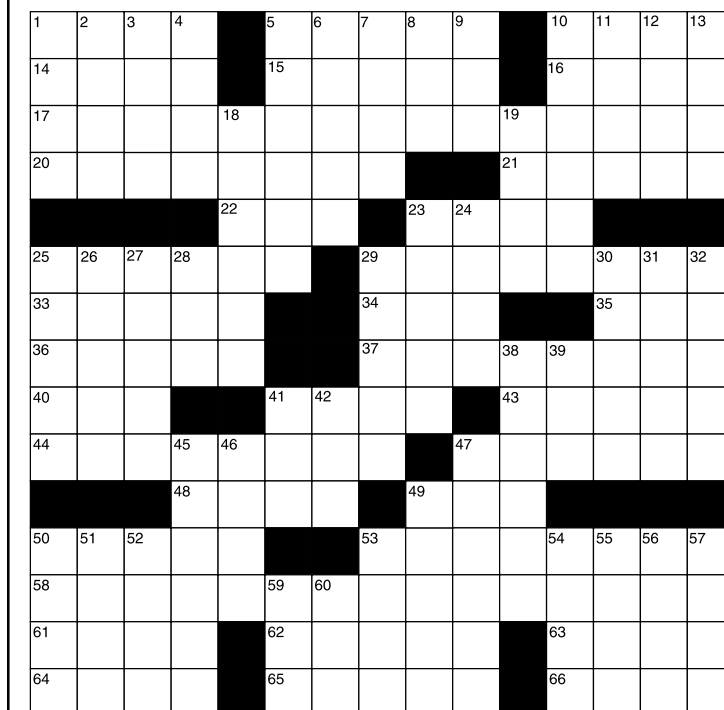
