

# Goodland boy earns third place

Dallas DeLaRosa, son of Harvey and Tammy DeLaRosa of Goodland, placed third in the boys 10-11 age group at this year's Punt, Pass and Kick sectional competition in Scott City on Oct. 16.

Other young athletes from the area competing there were Jazzmin Weis of Goodland (girls 10-11), Nathan Deeds of Goodland (boys 12-13) and Robert Doxon of Brewster (boys 14-15). All won their age group at the local competition at Cowboy Stadium on Sept. 25.

Angie Hillmer of Goodland won girls 12-13 age group at the local competition. Devon Garrett placed

second behind Deeds for 12-13 boys with J.P. McCool third.

Finishing second and third in the 10-11 boys was Nick Thomas and Laine Herl, respectively.

Luke Cox won the boys 8-9 age group with Kolt Trachsel second and Taylen Smith third. Blake Stasser won the boys 7-and-under competition with Josh David second and Kelby Smith third.

# Former Cowboys play Sunday

The second round of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference football playoffs will be played Sunday, a week after all four of the top seeds won their first-round game.

The Broncbusters of Garden City Community College travel to El Dorado to face the Grizzlies of Butler County Community College. Garden City defeated Dodge City Community College 35-21 last Sunday to improve to 6-3 for the season.

Former Goodland Cowboy Don Raymer, a sophomore wide receiver for the 'Busters, caught one pass for 16 yards and returned a punt five. He is the team's leading receiver with 40 catches for 546 yards and four touchdowns. Raymer also is Garden City's leading punt re-

turner, with 14 for 119 yards. His longest return so far this season is 22 yards.

Butler County, which defeated Garden City 32-24 on Sept. 18, remained the nation's top-ranked team in the latest National Junior College Athletic Association poll released Tuesday.

Last Sunday, the Grizzlies defeated Fort Scott Community College 59-0. They are 9-0 for the season.

In the other second-round game, the Blue Dragons of Hutchinson Community College will head to Coffeyville to face the Red Ravens of Coffeyville Community College.

The Dragons defeated Highland Community College 65-0 last Sunday and are now 6-3 for the season. In that game, freshman Jared Doke

saw action at quarterback, backing up sophomore Robert Coates. Doke, a 2004 graduate of Goodland High, was the Cowboys' starting quarterback during the 2003 season.

Hutchinson entered the nation's top 20 this week, tied at No. 19.

The Red Ravens, who defeated Independence Community College 86-0 last week, are 8-1 for the season and rose one spot to No. 6 in Tuesday's poll. During the regular season, Coffeyville beat Hutchinson 27-20 on Sept. 18.

The conference championship game will be played Nov. 7 with the location determined by Sunday's action. The game also will determine the junior college Region VI champion.
