22 at Grant Junior High.

In other business, the board:

- Voted unanimously, based on the recommendation of the school nurse, to make available inoculations for Hepatitis B to employees who have the greatest contact with students, such as custodial staff, and to any others members wanting it. The cost is around \$105 per person.
- Heard from Threse Armstrong of the Professional Development Committee that most of the certified teachers and staff were still participating in the professional development program. She said a new option is the opportunity to work with focus groups covering 10 areas through which they can increase their job knowledge while earning credits. The participants can chose which group interests them the most, or have the option of individual study.
- Voted unanimously to accept the

resignation of Lori Price Lalicker, a Title I reading teacher at North, effective Nov. 2, and the resignation of Toniarae Schreiber as a three-hour cook at the high school.

- Voted 6-1 to hire Char Avila as an assistant seventh-grade girls basketball coach, Cleve Trachsel as the seventh-grade boys basketball coach, Benjamin Coats as an assistant eighth-grade boys basketball coach, Gary Winter as an assistant junior high wrestling coach and Marilyn Snethen as a three-hour cook at the high school. Mike Campbell voted no; there was no discussion in open meeting.
- Voted 5-2 to hire Andy Scheopner as the high school softball coach, with Campbell and Ron Schilling opposed.
- Voted unanimously to hire Ryan Scheopner as an assistant softball coach.

The meeting adjourned around 8:20 p.m. The next meeting will be at 7 p.m. Monday at the district office, 1312 Main Ave.

Hearing for coach delayed

A preliminary hearing in arson charges against former Goodland High School football coach Tony Diehl was put off last week by District Judge Jack L. Burr in Sherman County District Court.



Diehl

Diehl, 34, 1108 Harrison, was arrested in August for attempted arson at his home. Neighbors noticed flames and called the police, who searched the house and arrested the coach.

After a night in the Sherman County Bastille, Diehl was charged in District Court with arson, a Level 6 person felony, and released on a \$25,000 supervised bond.

Diehl was allowed to return to his home in Goodland on Sept. 13.

If convicted, he faces a maximum of 38 months of jail time and 24 months of post release supervision.

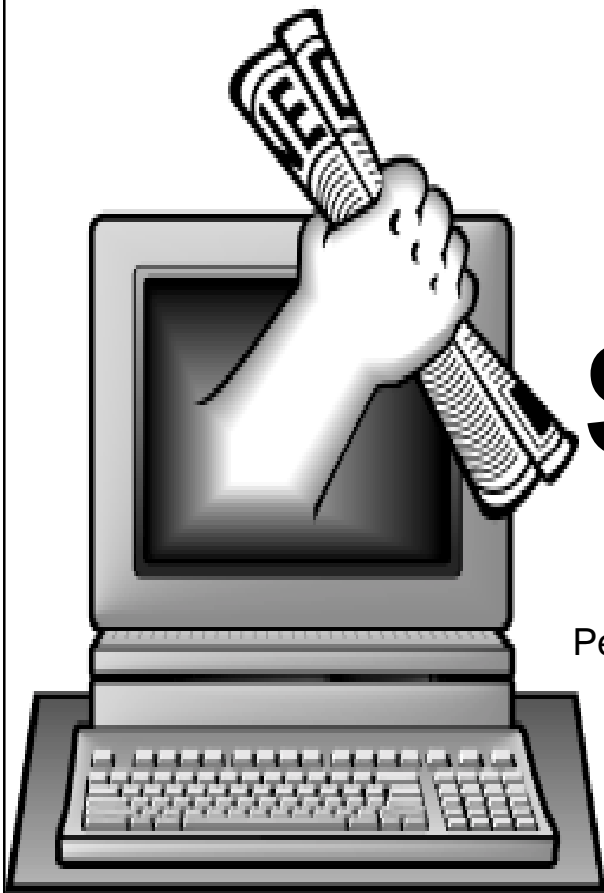
Colby lawyer Cal Williams is representing Diehl and Judge Burr will preside over the case.

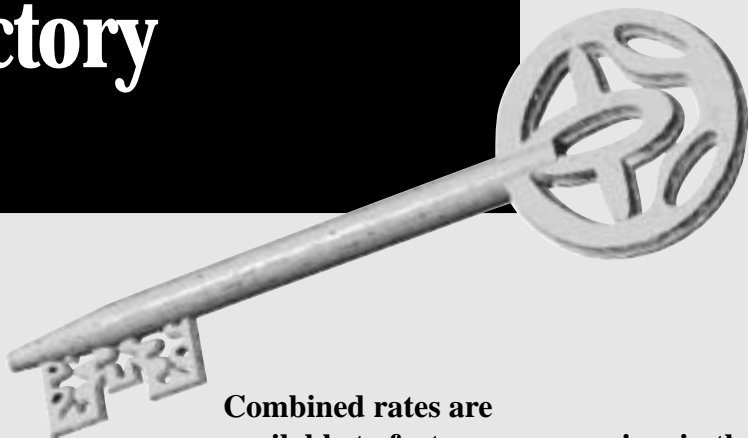

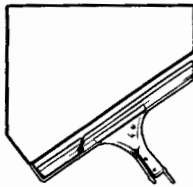
