Another Indian raid Saturday

For the third time this season, there is a band of Indians out to beat up the Goodland Cowboys on the football field.

The first two couldn't do it. This time, the tribe from Andale High School will try to unhorse the Cowboys on their way to the state championship game. The game kicks off at 4 p.m. Saturday at Cowboy Stadium.

Andale won its bi-district game on Tuesday 55-7 over Anthony-Harper-Chaparral High. The Indians finished the regular season 6-3 and in first place in District 13. All three of their losses were to other Class 4A schools, two of which made the playoffs, though both lost in the first round. The three losses came in the first five games of the season, and the Indians are now on a five-win streak.

Goodland coach Jon McLean said Andale's strength is its running game. He said the Indians like power football, using a lot of double-tight-end and full "T-back" formations. Full T-back is when all three running backs are lined up behind the quarterback.

McLean said Andale has three sophomore running backs who are not only fast and quick, but physical. He said the Indians have good size up front to create the holes the backs have been running through.

The Indians have an aggressive defense, McLean said, which will

use a 4-3 formation but may "walk up" a linebacker to make it 5-2 to counter Goodland's running game. He said some of the big guys on their offensive line play on defense as well.

In order to win, Andale will have to do something only two teams have managed to do this season: hold the Cowboys' rushing attack under 200 yards. The Ulysses Tigers did it on Oct. 8, limiting Goodland to 131 yards as they beat the Cowboys 34-20.

The other team was St. Francis on Sept. 10, which held Goodland to 142 yards but gave up three rushing touchdowns. In that game, however, the Cowboys had their best passing day of the season, gaining 130 yards through the air and adding another touchdown as they went on to win 33-8.

Goodland's ground offensive is led by senior Brock Lohr, who rushed for 245 yards on 42 carries against Hugoton in the bi-district game Tuesday. Lohr now has 1,373 yards for the season, averaging more than 130 yards per game. He also is the team's scoring leader with 142 points on 22 touchdowns and five two-point conversions, all on the ground.

Andale also will have to contend with a Cowboy defense that has become stingier and more stubborn as the season progressed. On Tuesday, that defense held Hugoton to seven "three-and-out" series out of 11 offensive drives.

Lohr, in his role as linebacker, leads the team in tackles with 89 including eight on Tuesday. Junior defensive back Jase Herl has 64 tackles for the season. He also has an interception, a blocked punt and a fumble recovery he returned 14 yards for a touchdown.

As a defensive back, Livengood has 61 tackles along with an interception and fumble recovery. From his defensive end position Jarmin has made 60 tackles, recovered three fumbles and intercepted one pass which he returned 12 yards. He is the Cowboys sack leader with four.

Penalties continue to be an area of concern for McLean as Goodland is being flagged, on average, more than eight times per game for 80 yards. On Tuesday, the Cowboys were penalized nine times for 79 yards, including one for unsportsman like conduct for the second straight game.

The winner of Saturday's game will face the winner of the Abilene-Rose Hill game on Friday, Nov. 12, in the sectional playoff game. Rose Hill, now 6-4, defeated Central High School of Andover 21-13 in Tuesday's bi-districts, and Abilene, also 6-4, defeated Collegiate High School of Wichita 42-41 in two overtimes.

The Goodland-Andale game will be broadcast on Goodland Radio KLOE (730 AM) starting around 3:40 p.m.

Lady Bulldogs third at state

The Lady Bulldogs of Brewster High School placed third at the state Class 1A volleyball tournament Friday and Saturday at Busch-Gross Coliseum on the campus of Fort Hays State University.

Brewster went 2-1 in pool play Friday, losing its opening match to Tipton, then defeating La Crosse and Flinthills High School of Rosalia. On Saturday, the Bulldogs lost to Axtell in the first round of the championship bracket, then came back to win a close three-game match over Flinthills for third place. The Bulldogs ended their season 39-6.

In their first match of the tournament against Tipton, the Bulldogs dropped the first game 25-21, came back to win the second 25-6, but lost the third 25-20.

In its next match against La Crosse, Brewster again played three games, winning the first 25-15, losing the second 25-18 and winning the third 25-17.

In the Bulldogs' third and final match in pool play, they defeated Flinthills 26-24, 25-22 which re-

sulted in a three-way tie for first between Brewster, Flinthills and Tipton. The percentage of games won in pool play determined the top two teams, after which head-to-head competition determined which would be first and second, with Brewster coming out on top.

"We got off to a slow start in pool play against Tipton," said coach Lynda McKee, "but were able to regroup and come back aggressively in our next two matches.

On Saturday, Brewster faced the Lady Eagles of Axtell, which placed second in its pool with a 2-1 record. The Eagles were able to win in two games, 25-20 and 25-21, sending the Bulldogs to the third-place match.

In that match, Brewster would again face the Lady Mustangs of Flinthills, who lost their first match Saturday to Centralia 25-16, 25-14. This time the Mustangs played the Bulldogs even tougher than the day before, with Brewster winning the first game 25-23 and Flinthills the second 25-20. However, it was the Lady Bulldogs who wanted it more

winning the third 25-22.

"On Saturday, we had a very competitive match with Axtell," McKee said, "but were unable to stop their best hitter when we needed to. The third-place match was a rematch with Flinthills, and we were thrilled to come away with the win."

Centralia defeated Axtell 25-20, 25-15 in the title match for the Panthers' eighth straight state championship.

Senior Andrea Horney led the Bulldog attack with 68 kills for the tournament, followed by junior Caitlan Rush with 39 and sophomore Avery Schultz with 34. Rush led the team in service aces with six. Junior Jalyn Reid was the assist leader with 49.

Horney was named to Kansas Volleyball Association's Class 1A All-Tournament Team.

"We had a great season," said McKee, "and we look forward to more in the future. We lose only one senior, Andrea Horney, off this team, so we're very optimistic."
