

# Cowboys beat Andale Indians 41-13

The Goodland High football team took another step closer to the state championship game Saturday, whipping the Andale Indians 41-13 at Cowboy Stadium.

The Cowboys go on the road next Saturday to face the Rockets of Rose Hill High in a sectional play-off. Rose Hill improved to 7-4 Saturday after beating the Abilene Cowboys 23-13 in their regional matchup.

Against the Indians, Goodland took a 7-0 lead in the first quarter when senior fullback Brock Lohr plunged into the end zone from the 1-yard line. About 10 minutes later, senior tailback Lane Winter scored from 11 yards out to make the score 13-0.

Andale scored on a 61-yard pass play with a little over two minutes left in the half to make it 13-7. In the third quarter, both teams scored a touchdown to make it 29-13 going into the fourth.

Then Goodland defense held the Indians scoreless while the Cowboys scored twice within a two-minute period. The first touchdown was on a 27-yard run by junior quarterback Wyatt Dautel and the second on a 64-yard run after an interception by senior defensive back Drew Wilkens, making the final 41-13.

Although the Andale defense held Lohr to less than 100 yards rushing, it failed to keep the Cowboys as a whole under 200 yards. The Goodland team posted 305 yards on the ground.

Senior David Livengood returned the opening kickoff to the Goodland 25. From there, the Cowboys drove down to the Andale 34, then an illegal motion penalty and an incomplete made it fourth and eight, and Goodland punted.

Junior Jase Herl downed the ball at the Andale 1, and the Indians went on offense. Two plays later they fumbled, and senior defensive end Bret Jarmin recovered on the 3.

With first and goal from the three, Lohr picked up two yards, but then the Andale stopped him on the next play. They stopped senior quarterback Derrick Raymer on the one after that. On fourth and inches, Lohr bashed through. Raymer kicked the extra point, and the Cowboys led 7-0.

Andale sophomore Josh Helmerman returned the subsequent kickoff 15 yards to the Indian 23. Two plays later, a pass interference penalty gave Andale first and 10 on its own 41, but the Indians could not get any further and were forced to punt.

Wilkens returned the punt to the Goodland 36, and the Cowboys drove to the Andale 19 as the gun for

the first quarter sounded. The drive was kept alive by a 2-yard run by Lohr on fourth and one.

Goodland continued its drive to start the second quarter, advancing to the Indian 11 where Winter took a pitch from Raymer and scampered into the end zone. Raymer's kick was wide left, but the Cowboys led 13-0.

After an 18-yard return by Helmerman to the Andale 26, Indian quarterback Toby Eck connected with wide receiver Adam Simon for 65 yards and a first and goal on the Goodland 9. Two plays later, the Indians fumbled again. Wilkens recovered at the 4.

With first and 10 from the 4, Lohr rushed for eight yards but then picked up only one yard on the next two plays. On fourth and one, the Cowboys punted.

Senior Brandon Cowan downed the ball at the Andale 26, and the Indians went back on the attack. After an 8-yard gain by sophomore running back Jason Robben, Andale got a first and 10 on its own 39 thanks to an illegal substitution penalty on Goodland. On the next play, Eck again hit Simon with a pass, this time for a 61-yard touchdown. Indian freshman Chris Ast kicked the extra point, which made the score 13-7.

Starting from their own 32, the Cowboys managed to gain 14 yards before they fumbled the ball back to Andale. However, on the following series, a holding penalty and an offensive pass interference call gave the Indians third and 30 from their own 29. After gaining 10 yards, facing fourth and 20, they punted.

On the next play, Winter picked up 21 yards from the Goodland 38 to the Andale 41. A personal foul penalty moved the ball 15 yards farther to the 26. On first down, Livengood was tackled for a 5-yard loss. On the next play, he caught a pass from Raymer for a 9-yard gain. On third down, Raymer's pass to junior Heath Chatfield was knocked down by Andale. On fourth and 5 on the 22, Raymer backed up and hit Jarmin in the end zone for a touchdown. Winter scored the two-point conversion and Goodland led 21-7 with 2 minutes 15 seconds left in the half.

Starting from their own 24, the Indians drove 71 yards in nine plays, but on third and two from the Goodland 5, Eck's pass into the end zone fell incomplete as time ran out.

After returning the second-half kickoff to its own 34, Andale could not make any headway and on fourth and 15, punted. Wilkens returned the ball to mid-field, and from there the Cowboys drove to the Indian 13. There the Andale defense turned stubborn, and on fourth

and 17 from the 20, stopped Goodland's drive.

The Cowboys returned the favor, holding the Indians to a "three-and-out." The punt was partly blocked and Goodland had first and 10 from the Andale 42. On the next play, Livengood ran 28 yards for a first down, and on the next, he ran the other 14 for a touchdown. Dautel, who replaced Raymer at quarterback, ran in the two-point conversion making it 29-7.

The Indians responded four plays later with another touchdown pass from Eck to Simon, this time for 76 yards. The pass for the two-point conversion failed and the score was now 29-13.

Livengood returned the subsequent kickoff to the Goodland 26. From there, the Cowboys picked up a first down at the 39, but then things

got sloppy and Goodland was penalized three times and Andale once in a span of three plays. A fourth Cowboy penalty was declined.

The third quarter ended with Goodland third and 12 on its own 37. The short break appeared to have a calming effect, as on the first play in the fourth quarter, Dautel hit Herl for a 13-yard pass play and a first down at the 50.

From there, the Cowboys drove to the Andale 27, converting a fourth and 1 on the way. Again on fourth and 1, Dautel ran through the Indian defense to the end zone. The two-point conversion attempt failed and the score was 35-13.

The subsequent kickoff had to be redone because of offsetting penalties and Helmerman returned the rekick to the 50. Two straight pass completions by Eck gave Andale

of three Indian defenders. Wingback David Livengood (with ball below right) avoided a tackle while gaining nine yards on a pass from Raymer.

first and 10 on the Cowboy 39.

Wilkens then stepped in front of an Indian receiver, intercepted the pass and ran 76 yards for the last score of the game to make it 41-13. The two-point conversion failed.

On first and 10 from the 31, after the subsequent kickoff, Andale was held for no gain, a second down pass was incomplete then on third down, Livengood sacked Eck for a 9-yard loss, forcing the Indians to punt.

Andale then held Goodland to just seven yards on four plays, stopping the Cowboys from converting on fourth and 3 at the Indian 42. However, Goodland was able to run three minute off the clock.

From their own 42, the Indians managed to get to the Goodland 44, but on fourth and 8, Eck's pass fell incomplete and the Cowboys took over with 42 seconds left. Dautel

then took a knee twice to end the game.

Lohr led the Cowboy rushing attack with 91 yards on 26 carries. Raymer gained 68 yards on 13 carries, all in the first half. Both Winter and Livengood ran for 50 yards, and Dautel for 45.

Raymer completed two of four passes for 31 yards, including the 22-yard touchdown to Jarmin. Dautel completed one of two for 13 yards. Jarmin, Herl and Livengood each had one reception.

Winter, in his role as defensive back, led the defense with eight tackles, followed by Lohr, as linebacker, with seven. Junior defensive linemen Mark Starr and Brandon Tatman, along with Livengood and Chatfield, each had a quarterback sack.

## Goodland native plays in final home match

Former Cowgirl Ashley Hallagin, a senior at Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas, was honored by her teammates and fans Saturday as part of "Seniors Night" during the Lady Cardinals' final home volleyball match of the year.

Hallagin, the only senior on the roster responded, with a match-high 58 assists as Lamar lost to Northwestern State University of Louisiana 3-2. She also had 10 digs,

the fourth time this season she was in double figures in both categories.

On Friday, Hallagin recorded 38 assists and 13 digs as Lamar defeated the University of Louisiana at Monroe 3-0.

Hallagin, one of only three Cardinals to play in all 108 games for the season, leads her team in assists with 610 and in service aces with 31. She is second on the list for digs with 374 and also has 38 kills.

This is Hallagin's second year on Lamar's team, she played for Barton County Community College her freshman and sophomore seasons. She is the daughter of Rollie and Jean Hallagin of Goodland and is a

2000 graduate of Goodland High School. She is a biology major.

The Cardinals are now 9-21 for the season and 2-16 in the Southland Conference. They will play their final matches of the regular season tonight at Nicholls State University in Thibodaux, La., and Saturday against Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, Texas.
