Cowboys out to keep Rockets from lifting off

The Goodland Star-News The Rockets of Rose Hill High School learned how to beat Cowboys this past Saturday, defeating Abilene High School 21-13, but this Saturday they will face a posse from another part of the territory.

The Rose Hill players may be up to the challenge, even though the Rockets finished second in District 10 with a 5-4 record, because they have proven themselves a team to reckon with in the state playoffs.

Rose Hill defeated previously unbeaten Central High School of Andover 21-13 in the first round on Nov. 2, then four days later they whipped Abilene.

The Cowboys will probably have to play without their senior quarterback, Derrick Raymer, who, Coach Jon McLean said, will dress for the game but is "doubtful" as he hopes to give Raymer's knees a rest.

Junior Wyatt Dautel, who played quarterback in the second half against Andale, will fill in for Raymer. Mclean said he feels comfortable with Dautel running the offense.

Except for some soreness and slight sprains, he said, the rest of the Cowboys are healthy and ready to play.

Now 7-4, Rose Hill finally gets a home playoff game when the Cowboys visit Stanley Stadium Saturday for a sectional matchup. Kickoff is at 5:30 p.m. (Central Time).

"Rose Hill is a good team who will run out of a lot of different offensive formations to try and confuse us," said coach McLean. "We will have to be very disciplined on defense."

McLean said the Rockets like to run their fullback and use a lot of motion. They are effective throwing the ball and have a good receiver in James Hensley.

Rose Hill's victory over Abilene last Saturday was its first regional playoff win. The Rockets took a 10-0 lead, then saw it disappear as Abilene scored two touchdowns in the final seven minutes of the first half to take a 13-10 halftime lead.

Neither team scored in the third quarter, then the Rockets took off in the fourth for a pair of touchdowns, the second on a pass interception, to win 21-13.

Senior fullback Blake Ringwall ran for 124 yards on 29 carries and caught two passes for 17 more. Ringwall also starred on defense, scoring on the interception return.

Rose Hill quarterback Jared McRae completed seven of 14 passes for 59 yards, though one pass was picked off. He ran 11 times for 41 yards, including a 16-yard touchdown. Hensley caught four of McRae's passes for 32 yards.
