## Bad weekend for football

Last week, four area high school football teams were in the hunt for the state championship, but all four lost this weekend.

The Goodland Cowboys were outplayed by the Rockets of Rose Hill High, losing 30-12 Saturday in Rose Hill. The Rockets, now 8-4, will play host to the Ulysses Tigers on Friday in one of the Class 4A sub-state games. The Tigers defeated Wellington 28-22 on Friday.

In Class 2-1A, the St. Francis In-

dians and Oakley Plainsmen both lost their sectional playoff games Friday. St. Francis fell 51-14 to Smith Center and Oakley lost to Claflin 21-12. The Indians finished their season 8-4 and the Plainsmen ended up 10-2.

Smith Center and Claflin, both 12-0, will face each other Friday, in Claflin.

In Division II eight-man football, the Coyotes of Weskan suffered their only loss of the season Friday

to the Hanston Elks 66-20 in a sub-state game. The Coyotes ended their season 11-1. The Elks, now 12-0, knocked the Brewster Bulldogs out of the playoffs the week before in the regionals.

Hanston will face Sylvan Unified High School of Sylvan Grove in the championship game on Saturday, Nov. 27, at the Russell High School stadium.

## Six Bulldogs make all-league

Six Brewster High School football players have been honored on the Western Kansas Liberty League all-league team for the 2004 season.

The league's football coaches made the selections at a meeting last Wednesday.

Senior Jake Long was a triple selection, being named to the first team as a defensive back and to the second team as a running back and as a kick-return specialist.

Junior Branson Gilley was a double first-team selection as quarterback and defensive back. Senior Heath Baird made the first team as a tight end/receiver. Junior Garrett

Smith was a second team pick as a defensive lineman.

Honorable mention went to senior Paul Flanders as a defensive lineman and to junior Kyle O'Connor as tight end/receiver.

The Bulldogs finished their season 6-4 and made it to the regionals of the Division II eight-man state playoffs, where they lost to Hanston 66-20 on Nov. 6. The Elks will play in the state championship on Nov. 27 in Russell.

The Wildcats of Wallace County High School of Sharon Springs also had six players selected. Senior Kris Dobbs was a double pick to the first

team as a defensive lineman and earning honorable mention as an offensive guard.

Senior Kevin Heyl was a first team selection as tight end/receiver. Senior Tyrell Robben made the second team as a defensive back and junior Kyle Elder was a second team pick as a defensive lineman.

Senior Jesse Baker received honorable mention as a defensive lineman, as did junior Sean Vliem as a defensive back.

The Wildcats ended their season 5-3.

## Volleyball players make all-league

Five Brewster High School volleyball players have been named to the Western Kansas Liberty League all-league team for the 2004 season.

Senior Andrea Horney and junior Caitlan Rush were picked for the first team by the league coaches. Junior Jalyn Reid was named to the

second team and sophomore Avery Schultz to the third team. Sophomore Audrey Hoyt received honorable mention.

The Lady Bulldogs finished their season 39-6, winning the league title and placed third at the state Class 1A tournament.

The Lady Wildcats of Wallace County High School of Sharon Springs had three players on the team.

Junior Brandi Bertrand made the first team, sophomore Nikki Welsh the second team and sophomore Natalie Elder the third team.

## Sterling tops both preseason polls

The men's and women's basketball teams of Sterling College both were picked first in the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference coaches' preseason polls.

Ten Kansas colleges and universities make up the conference, all of which play Division II basketball in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

The members are Bethany College in Lindsborg, Bethel College in North Newton, Friends University in Wichita, Kansas Wesleyan University in Salina, McPherson College, Ottawa University, Sterling College, Southwestern College in Winfield, Tabor College in Hillsboro and the University of Saint Mary in Leavenworth.

The Warriors of Sterling were 17-15 overall last season and 15-3 in the conference, finishing second to Tabor. Sterling lost in the first round of the national playoffs last March

and is ranked No. 24 in the association's national preseason poll.

The Warriors opened their season Saturday with a 76-70 loss to Newman University in Wichita.

The Lady Warriors finished the 2003-2004 season 25-6 overall and were first in the conference with a 16-2 record. In national playoffs, Sterling won its first round match but lost in the second.

The Lady Warriors were ranked No. 11 in last season's final poll and are ranked No. 15 in this year's preseason poll. They opened their season last Tuesday with a 74-61 over Baker University in Baldwin. The team is now 2-1 after splitting its games this past weekend at the Jewell Tourney at William Jewell College in Liberty, Mo.

Former Brewster Bulldog standout Alicia Collett, now a sophomore at Sterling, is in her second season on the Warriors' roster.

Both Tabor basketball teams were picked No. 2 in the coaches' poll. The Bluejay men finished 16-16 overall last season and 14-4 in the conference. Tabor also lost in the first round of the national playoffs. The Bluejays opened the season Saturday with a 66-52 loss to Northwestern Oklahoma State University in Alva, Okla.

The Lady Jays finished last season 18-12 overall and 11-7 in the conference for fourth place.

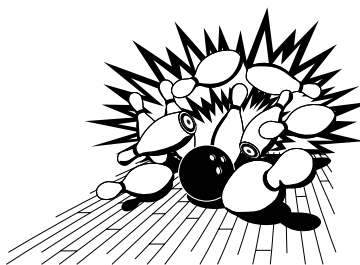

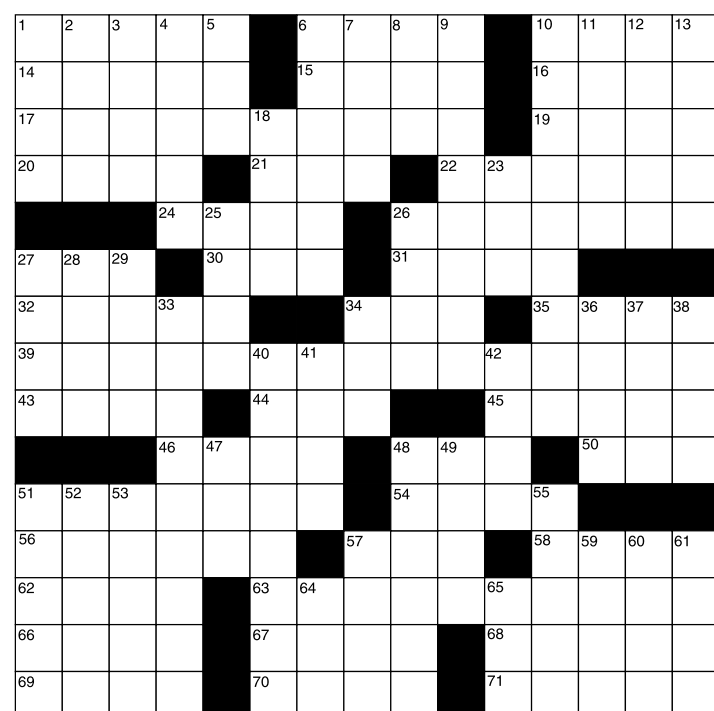
