Rockets pass over Cowboys to win 30-12

The Goodland Star-News The Rockets of Rose Hill High School thrilled the hometown crowd Saturday by beating the Goodland Cowboys 30-12 in the sectionals of the state Class 4A football playoffs.

The Rockets took off in the first quarter, scoring 16 unanswered points. They outscored Goodland 14-12 in the second. Neither team scored in the second half, making the final 30-12.

More than 250 fans from Goodland made the six-to-seven-hour trip to Stanley Stadium to cheer on the Cowboys, who finished their season 10-2 under first-year coach Jon McLean.

Senior James Hensley of Rose Hill returned the opening kickoff to the Rockets' 30-yard line. Two plays later, Rose Hill had first and 10 on the Goodland 48 when senior quarterback Jared McRae hit Hensley for a 48-yard pass and a touchdown. Hensley kicked the extra point and the Rockets led 7-0 with just over 30 seconds gone from he

Junior Wyatt Dautel returned the subsequent kickoff nine yards to the Goodland 33. On the first play from scrimmage Dautel, in his first start at quarterback, pitched the ball to senior tailback Lane Winter, who tried to hit senior tight end Bret Jarmin on a deep pass. Hensley, playing defensive back, intercepted the ball, giving Rose Hill first and 10 on its own 27.

The Cowboys defense held the Rockets to "three-and-out," forcing a punt, however Rose Hill returned the favor and four plays later forced Goodland to punt. Starting from their own 47, the Rockets were able to drive to the Goodland nine, but Goodland defensive back Derek Fenner stopped the drive with an interception on the 3.

The Cowboys could not get anything going, and on third down Dautel was caught in the end zone by the Rose Hill linebacker Tyler Rockets' lead to 9-0.


