
Mustangs on the move

Goodland athlete leads team in scoring

Jayci, the daughter of Dennis and Karen Stone of Goodland, is a 2003 graduate of Goodland High School, where she lettered in volleyball and track and field as well as basketball.

This is Stone's second season with the Lady Trojans. Last year, the team finished 29-4 and ranked No. 8 in the final National Junior College Athletic Association poll.

The Colby women started their season on Nov. 5 at the Ramada Roundball Classic in Sterling, Colo., against host Northeastern Junior College. Colby defeated the Plainswomen 83-80 in double overtime after trailing by five points at

The following day, Colby beat Casper College (Wyo.) 72-61. Stone led the team with 16 points. She and freshman Rita Kollo both grabbed eight rebounds.

Stone hit three of six shots from behind the three-point arc for nine of her points. Freshman Ivy Ramsey of Colby, who played for the Lady Eagles last season, hit on three of five from behind the arc for all nine of her points.







The Amateur Wrestling News, Wrestling International News and the Intermat/National Wrestling Coaches Association all listed Murray as the top man in his weight. Murray was 24-7 as a junior, finishing second in the NCAA and the Big 12 Conference championships.

Matt, the son of Jim and Bernice Murray of Colby, is a mathematics education major. He went 138-12 as a wrestler for Colby High School, winning the state Class 4A championship at 135 pounds his senior year. He also lettered in cross country and tennis for the Eagles.

As a team, the Cornhuskers were ranked No. 3 by the Amateur Wrestling News and the coaches association, and No. 4 by the Wrestling International News. Six other Nebraska wrestlers were top-10 picks in all three polls.

The 'Huskers open their season today with a home dual meet against Hofstra University (N.Y.).

Lady Tigers head to Kearney, Neb., for return visit

The Fort Hays State University volleyball team will travel back to Kearney, Neb., Friday for the NCAA Division II Southwest Regional Tournament.

The women are 29-4 after finishing second at the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference post-season tournament last weekend, losing to the host University of Nebraska-Kearney 3-0 in the title match. The Lady Lopers, now 36-0, are responsible for three of Fort Hays' four losses this season.

Fort Hays is seeded No. 2 at the regional tourney, behind Nebraska-Kearney, and will face seventhseeded Rockhurst University in its first match. The Lady Hawks, now 26-9, lost to the Tigers 3-1 on Oct.

The Tigers are ranked No. 12 in the American Volleyball Coaches Association NCAA Division II poll released Tuesday. The Lopers remain the nation's No. 1 team, receiving 33 of 35 first-place votes. Rockhurst is No. 24.
