Statistics discussed were:

- Poverty and food insecurity rates are closely linked. In Kansas, the unemployment rate rose from 3.9 percent in 2000 to 5.2 percent in 2003.

- The state ranks 12th for children living in poverty: more than one in ten.

- Kansas food stamp use is below the national average for food insecure households — only about 50 percent of those eligible use food stamps.

- Households rated food insecure make up 11.3 percent of those in the state, and 3.4 percent are food insecure with hunger also noted.

In closing, this prayer was read: To those who have hunger, give bread. To those who have bread give a hunger for justice.

Each member received a home security checklist.

The meeting was adjourned, and the club will meet next on Tuesday, Dec. 7, for lunch for the Christmas meeting.

**November 19, 1904:** Teachers Hold Monthly Meeting — The teachers of Sherman County met in the high school building Nov. 5 and took up the first four chapters of the reading circle work. Thirty percent of the examination questions are based on their work, and the teachers of Sherman County intend to keep up with the times.

The next meeting will be held on the 3rd of December. Several teachers from here intend to attend the Northwest Teachers' Association at Oberlin on Nov. 24 and 25.

**November 22, 1904:** Basket Social — The people in the neighborhood of Pleasant Valley School house, district 83, had a royal time one evening last week, in holding a basket social.

George McClelland was the auctioneer and managed to sell the bas-

kets at trust prices, the 31 baskets netting \$43.85. One went as high as \$3.25, and all of them averaged more than \$1.50.

Not only did the young and old buy and dine, but a program both musical and literary was rendered, which was highly appreciated. Miss Euroth Stewart is the teacher of the school and has been very successful in her calling.

**November 23, 1904:** Carried Kansas by 124,582 — President Roosevelt carried every county in Kansas. Hoch's plurality for Governor was 68,815, the second largest ever given a Kansas governor.

Nationally the election was a phenomenon, and Roosevelt's sweeping victory marks a political epoch.
