Goodland scholars place fourth

The Goodland High Scholars Bowl team wound up fourth at the Goodland Cowboy Classic Monday.

Ten teams competed in Monday's tournament, with Scott City taking first place with a 9-0 record. Quinter and Rawlins County of Atwood tied at 7-2, with Quinter taking second based on head-to-head competition.

Goodland and Wallace County of Sharon Springs tied at 6-3. Goodland beat Wallace County 50-10 in the seventh round.

The tournament consisted of nine rounds, during which each team faced every other team once. Each

team comprised three to five students, with some rotating members between rounds.

In each matchup, the students got 17 questions to answer or solve. The students responded to three questions each in social science, literary arts, mathematics, science and fine arts. There also was a foreign-language phrase to be translated, which was shown briefly, written in French, German and Spanish. A question about the year in review concluded each match.

A team receives 10 points for each right answer and loses five in they ring in before the entire question is read and answer incorrectly.

Members of Goodland's team

were seniors Charles Lammers, Simon Wang and Mallory Younger, and sophomores Sarah Borneman, Michael Bryce and Lea Shores.

Coach Jo Ann Wahrman, a librarian at the high school, said she wants to thank all the teachers and high school staff, along with volunteers Christie Rasure, Linda Franklin, Scott Mentzer and Dave Floyd, who helped with the tournament. She said several coaches complemented her on how smoothly the event ran.

The scholars will be back in action at 3 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 30, at Greeley County High School in Tribune.

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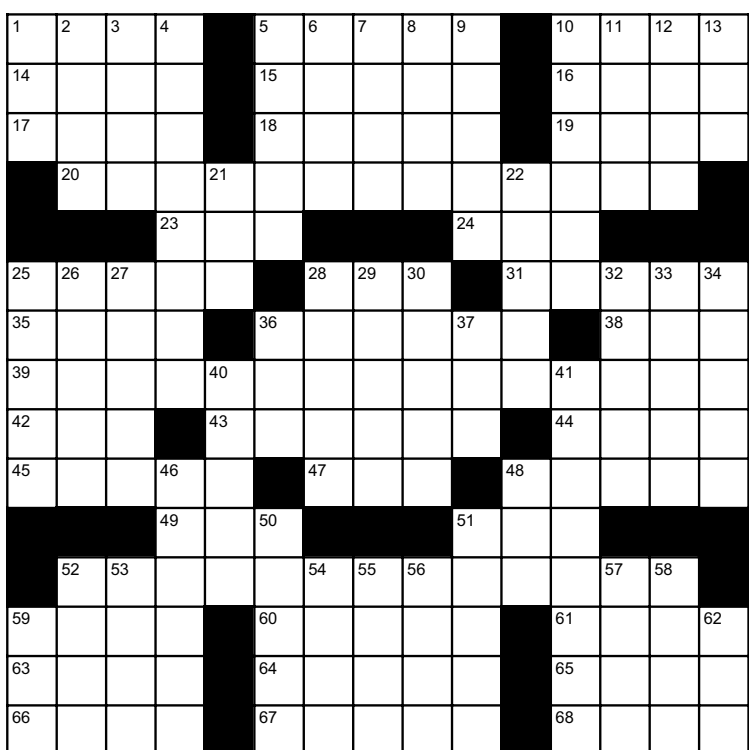
