Dewey widow fought for half of land here

November 24, 1904: Dewey Case in Sherman County — The pending case in the court of Cook county, Ill., in which the validity of the will of the late C.P. Dewey has been contested by the blood relatives to oust Charles T. Killen from participating in the benefits of the will, has been featured in Sherman County in the way of a suit brought by Dewey’s widow to secure one half interest in Dewey lands in Sherman County. The summons by publication appears in this issue, and includes more than a hundred quarter sections of land.
