#### Dewey widow fought for half of land here By Evelyn Ward 24-7-39; S 1/2 SW 24-7-39; N 1/2 today in history Sherman County Historical Society

November 24, 1904: Dewey Case in Sherman County — The pending case in the court of Cook county, Ill., in which the validity of the will of the late C.P. Dewey has been contested by the blood relatives to oust Charles T.
