## Goodland wrestlers open season with win over tough Hoxie team

The Goodland Star-News The Goodland High wrestling team opened its season with an impressive 48-25 win over the Hoxie Indians last Thursday in a dual meet in Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The Cowboys, ranked No. 7 in Class 4A by the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association, placed third last year at the state tournament and had three individual champions.

The Hoxie Indians, ranked No. 1 in Class 3-2-1A, were last year's state runner-up with four individual champions.

The Cowboys won six of the first seven matches to build up a 30-6 lead, then three of the next seven to hang on for the win.

Freshman Jordan Albers, wrestling at 103 pounds, started the scoring for Goodland by winning a 12-2 major decision over Hoxie's Tanner Popp. That gave the Cowboys a 4-0 lead.

At 112 pounds, sophomore Brett Bahe pinned Kevin Moss of Hoxie at 1 minute 27 seconds into the first period to increase Goodland's lead to 10-0. Bahe was leading 9-1 at the time. He placed fourth at 103 pounds at last year's state tournament.

Junior Brandon Zelfer added five points to the Cowboys' lead with a 6. 15-0 technical fall over Loren Cressler about halfway through the third period of the 119-pound match.
